AT MT. ST. MARY'S ACADEMY

Young Women Take Vows in Church Connected with the School.

VERY INTERESTING CEREMONY

An impressive ceremony in the church in connection with Mount St. Mary's academy, Cherokee, Ia., took place when two young women were received into the order of the Servants of Mary and six took the final vows. The former were Miss Laura Kislava of Sioux City and Miss Rosella Sheridan of Cherokee. The latter were Sisters Mary Petronilla of the Sacred Heart, Mary Mildred of the Holy Rosary, Mary Agatha of our Mother of Sorrows, Mary Bernadette of our Lady of Lourdes, Mary Annunziata of the Incarnate Word and Mary Paula of the Sacred Heart.

Solemn high mass was sung at 9:30, the Rev. William P. Desmond, the pastor, being the celebrant, with Rev. Father McCormick of Sheldon as deacon, and Rev. Father Schmittler of Mary Hill as sub-deacon. Rev. Father Murphy of Kincaid was master of ceremonies, and a large number of priests from the neighboring parishes filled the sanctuary. The habit was given the new novitiates by Rev. John Danahy, S. J., delegated by the Bishop of Sioux City.

Forest Park university in St. Louis offers instruction of a high order in piano and voice. Senior and junior colleges and preparatory certificate admits to all colleges. Instruction is given covering a wide range. The university is now in its fifty-fifth year.

At Oakland, Cal.

In the beautiful San Francisco suburb of Oakland is located Mills college, the only woman's college on the Pacific coast. Besides the standard departments it provides full training in home economics and in gymnasium and playground supervision.

Mount St. Mary's Seminary, Omaha.

Conducted by Sisters of Mercy. The location of Mount St. Mary's seminary is one of the best in Omaha at Fifteenth and Castellar streets. Special attention is given to academic, normal and preparatory courses, music and art. It is accredited to the state university. The students are under the personal supervision of the Sisters at all times. A Telegraph School.
