Freddie Welsh's Manager Says Not for Ten-Round Bouts, but Then Freddie Is a Champ.

MAY BE GIVEN TRIAL IN GOTHAM

NEW YORK, Aug. 28.-There is a great diversity of opinion among boxing adherents in the metropolis as to the advisibility of allowing referees' decisions in ten-round bouts in the Empire state. The general run of fandom appears to be decidedly in favor of revising the laws governing boxing so as to permit of official verdicts, while those better versed in boxing love are just as decidedly against amending the Frawley faw to legalize decisions.

From one quarter in particular there is a concerted cry against empowering the referee to render an official verdict. That guarter is constituted of champions and near champions in the various divisions. Especially antagonistic against the movement is Freddie Weish, the lightweight champion, and his mentor, Harry Pollok

As Weish is at present enjoying a protracted slesta in California it devolves upon "Handsome Harry" to express Weish's sentiments and those of his own, in the matter, says Harold:

"If decisions are made legal in New York state, I can guarantee you that no champions will appear before New York audiences until the law is revised to its present status. What champion, I ask you, will take a chance with his title in a ten-round bout? And, amain, who will be responsible for the wrong action of a referee in case a title changes hands on his unfair ruling, whether it is made honeatly or with malics aforethought?

"One thing I can assure you of: Welsh will not take part in any bouts here if decisions are permitted. Do you think any of the other champions-Williams, Kilbane or Willard-would take a chance in a short bout with their titles at stake? Nay, nay, you cannot convince me that they will, for I am sure they all will look upon the new order in the same light Freddie does."


