CASH CORN ALSO DROPS A BIT

OMAHA, August 31, 1915. The cash wheat market was decidedly bearish today, and dropped from 30 to 32 per bushel.

Receipts were fair and the sales were comparatively light. There was not much demand for cash corn and the market was quiet, lower.

Primary wheat receipts were 1,382,000 bu. against 1,200,000 bu. and shipments of 1,000,000 bu. last year.

Primary corn receipts were 2,134,000 bu. and shipments 1,288,000 bu. against 2,000,000 bu. and shipments of 2,400,000 bu. last year.
