CONFER ON SOUTH SIDE 'PHONE TOLL

Company Officials Declare Readjustment of Rates Necessary if Toll is Abolished.

WOULD ENTAIL GREAT COST

If the Omaha-South Omaha telephone tolls should be abolished and the service thrown open to unrestricted conversation it would be necessary to invest \$150,000 in additional equipment and to readjust rates. That was the gist of a conference held in the city council chamber between Commissioners Butler, Kugel, Withnell and Jardine, Corporation Counsel Lambert, and E. M. Morsman, Guy H. Pratt and L. B. Wilson, general counsel, general commercial superintendent and district superintendent, respectively, of the Nebraska Telephone company.

The meeting resolved itself into a confab for the exchange of ideas. Another conference will be held within a week

Want Tolls Abolished.

The genesis of the situation arose at a meeting of the council when a committee was appointed to meet the telephone penple and determine whether the existing telephone tolls between Omaha and South Omaha should be abolished in view of

The telephone people explained that the rates in Omaha and South Omaha are based upon the possibilities of service. For instance, the Omaha business man pays \$7 a month for service over an area which includes Florence, Dundee, Ben-son, South Omaha, Bellevue and Fort Crook. If the South Omaha business man wants his phone for his immediate district he pays 14 a month, but he wants service over the territory mentioned he Should Pay for Service.

Under present rate conditions 1,856 patrons in Omaha proper have general zone telephones, which means they pay 50 cents more a month for residence, or \$1 more a month for business places, for unlimited South Omaha service. Aside from that, there are 5-cent calls which the telephone people state average one call per month per patron. Their argument is that patrons who want this service should pay for it rather than distribating the cost over the entire zone. "If we should remove this extra toll

restriction I figure that our Omaha-South Omaha calls would increase 200 to 200 per cent at once, because people would visit back and forth over their telephones," declared Mr. Pratt.

"The present arrangement is a restriction against unwarranted use of the service," was another statement by the phone

Big Power Boat and Ten Barges Wanted for River Service

Decatur business interests have made arrangements whereby the captain will steam down the river immediately to take up this work, provided Decatur can furnish him some big barges at once to work with.

Decatur got in touch with the Omaha Commercial club and the club is now negotiating with the federal government for ten large barges at present lying in dry dock at Sloux City. Since these government barges are not in use at present, every confidence is felt that the club will reach a satisfactory agreement with the government with regard to getting the use of them, at least this fall until the river freezes.


