

CONFER ON SOUTH SIDE 'PHONE TOLL

Company Officials Declare Readjustment of Rates Necessary if Toll is Abolished.

WOULD ENTAIL GREAT COST

If the Omaha-South Omaha telephone tolls should be abolished and the service thrown open to unrestricted conversation it would be necessary to invest \$150,000 in additional equipment and to readjust rates.

Want Tolls Abolished.

The genesis of the situation arose at a meeting of the council when a committee was appointed to raise the telephone people and determine whether the existing tolls between Omaha and South Omaha should be abolished in view of consolidation.

The telephone people explained that the rates in Omaha and South Omaha are based upon the possibilities of service. For instance, the Omaha business man pays \$7 a month for service over an area which includes Florence, Dundee, Benson, South Omaha, Bellevue and Fort Crook.

Should Pay for Service.

Under present rate conditions, 1500 patrons in Omaha proper have general zone telephones, which means they pay 80 cents more a month for residence, or \$1 more a month for business places, for unlimited South Omaha service.

"The present arrangement is a restriction against unwarranted use of the service," was another statement by the phone officials.
