RUSSIANS WIN THREE VICTORIES OVER TEUTONS Position of the Czar's Army is Distinctly Improved by Successes on Line from Vilna to Galicia.

GERMANS MENACE DVNSK To the Far North the Teutons Are Advancing Slowly Toward a New Objective. RUSS SCORE NORTH OF PINSK LONDON, Sept. 25.—The position of the Russians from Vilna to the Galician frontier appears to have been improved greatly, three distinct victories having been recorded almost simultaneously at widely scattered points on the eastern front.

CAL REVERSES TEMPORARY East of Vilna, north of Pinsk, and in the vicinity of Lutsk, the Russians have scored heavily. The Germans characterize their reverses east of Vilna—that is, at the Viteka railway junction—as of a temporary character, notwithstanding their losses of guns and prisoners.

CHINESE START RIOT TO ENFORCE BOYCOTT ON JAPANESE WARES SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Sept. 25.—The vigor with which the Chinese have been enforcing a boycott against the Japanese and their merchandise was revealed today by the arrest of three Chinese who were alleged to have taken part in a small riot in a Chinatown store here, one of several operated here and in Los Angeles by the Sing Fat company.
