

"Take Your Bearings" Is the Advice Sunday Gives Audience

The sermon of "Billy" Sunday at the tabernacle yesterday afternoon was on the subject: "Taking Our Bearings." His text was: "Ye have not passed this way heretofore," Joshua, III, 1.

The great army of Israel, under Joshua, was encamped on the left bank above the Jordan, where they had been brought to a standstill by the raging river, which was floodtide and out of its banks. At last the forty years of wandering in the wilderness had come to an end. The time had arrived for the tribes to take possession of their inheritance in the promised land.

Three days were to be devoted to rest and preparation for the greatest achievement ever undertaken by the Jewish nation. From headquarters officers were sent throughout the camp to inform, instruct and prepare the people. Perhaps a trumpet went with the herald to sound the bugle to call the people together. Speeches were made giving full information concerning the movement of the army. Each officer would explain what was expected of every man and full information given as to the manner and time when the signal for something else is to happen.

At a commander Joshua was now and untried. Nobody knew anything about his ability. He had never operated an independent command up until this time. He had no past successes as a prestige to give the people confidence. The people had known no great commander up to this time. Not even Moses, and it is natural that Joshua would suffer from comparison his appearance—language—orders—new way of doing things.

When a new preacher assumes charge of a church he is up against the same difficulty. He is contrasted with his predecessor. And that's the trouble, I guess, whenever a wife marries a second time; she's up against the same sort of a proposition. You hear: "He doesn't preach like Brother Barker used to!" "Land's sakes! Did you ever hear anybody preach like that?" "What a queer way he led the prayer meeting!"

Just because he has got up there he wants to show off! He thinks he is a bigger man than Moses! Who ever heard of taking priests into battle? Moses forgot more than Joshua ever knew, whose name he lacked. I suppose nobody ought to be guilty of originality even when it comes to knocking down the police and pushing over ushers and breaking windows.

All have witnessed just such scenes when an effort is made toward a revival of religion. Some say, "Oh, he preaches too much hell." Some may say he doesn't preach enough hell. Well, believe me, I'll give you enough hell before I'm through. All the hells in the Bible. Others say, "He doesn't preach enough." Some say, "He is sensational!" Others say, "O, he is vulgar!" Some say, "I don't like the music!" Others say, "We have too much music!"

But the man that God sends never fails. Had the walls of Jericho been a mile thick and ten miles high Joshua would have gone against them with the same boldness. He was not depending on his soldiers, nor the priests, nor the weather, nor the rams' horns, nor himself, nor his feeling, but the word of the living God. The wilderness-worn veterans are now about to take the step that would make them a great nation—a people with a God-chosen destiny—a people under the Almighty's especial care. Before they set foot in that raging river they had to do more hard thinking than they had ever done. In years ago they had done lots of foolish things impulsively. That is why they had been tramping forty years and never reaching the promised land!
