One Fixed for National Safety Committee and One by the Laws of Nebraska.

WARRANT CASE INTO COURTS

(From a Staff Correspondent.) LINCOLN, Oct. 4.—(Special.)—Two fire prevention days will be celebrated in Nebraska this fall, one created by Governor Morehead by special proclamation at the request of the National Safety Committee, and the other by statute, which provides for observance on the first Friday after the first Monday in November.

Governor Morehead named October 9 as one date at the request of the National Safety Committee. He will shortly issue a second proclamation for the second date as provided by statute.

Superintendent A. O. Thomas of the Nebraska schools, and Fire Commissioner Ridgell will pass over the October date and center their efforts in November. They will send out literature and instructions for them.

The fire commissioner will call on the fire chiefs, the mayors of cities and city council to observe the day in a general cleanup campaign to prevent winter conflagrations. The warnings and drills for schools will be included in the superintendent's instructions.

To Sue Over Warrants. Application was made to the supreme court today by Assistant Attorney General Ayres for permission to file a mandamus suit against State Treasurer Hall and on behalf of Fire Commissioner Ridgell. The suit will be to compel the treasurer to deliver warrants for expenses and salaries of the fire commissioner's office since September 1.

A previous suit relative to warrants in July, August and June, was withdrawn when the treasurer found he had authority to pay them.

Greenher at Lincoln. Chris Greenher, who was Senator Hitchcock's choice for internal revenue collector, but who failed to land through the opposition of the Bryans, paid a visit to the capitol today, having business with the Board of Control. He also had a half hour's conference with Governor Morehead in the latter's private office.

Corn Good in Gage. Gene Mumford, who, when he is acting as the governor's private secretary, is just plain Farmer "Gene," brought along several ears of corn from his Gage county farm. "Gene" had a field of sixty acres which promises sixty-five bushels to the acre and another of thirty acres just as good. Mr. Mumford said most of the Gage county corn was out of the way of frost and a sharp nip would help it materially in preparing it for husking.

Federation Grows Stronger. The State Federation of Labor may lose the support of the Lincoln Typographical union because of its stand on the proposed prohibition amendment, but it gained five other unions on the same ground, according to word reaching Labor Commissioner Coffey. Two carmen's unions, one in South Omaha and one in Fremont, and the carpenters' union of Fremont, have joined the federation and two others signified their intention of becoming members.

Inspect Drainage Ditch. Governor Morehead and State Engineer Johnson went to Richardson county yesterday for an inspection of drainage ditches in that vicinity, after the governor had been requested by a delegation of people from that section to override Johnson's objections to a drainage project. The state engineer claimed the plans drafted by the district to take care of the flood waters along the lower Nemaha would not work out. He is working on a system of levees and parallel ditches to relieve conditions in that section, where thousands of acres of crops were ruined by the high water this year.

BOARD OF CONTROL TAKES UP CONTRACTS AT KEARNEY (From a Staff Correspondent.) LINCOLN, Oct. 4.—(Special.)—The State Board of Control today awarded a contract for the construction of a boiler and a laundry for the state tuberculosis hospital at Kearney to Water Knutzen of that city for \$9,987. Bids for the plumbing and wiring were rejected as not being in the proper form.

At the same time the board rejected all bids for the construction of a residence for the superintendent as being too high, and postponed the building to see how the building fund would be about.

The 1915 legislature appropriated \$16,250 for the buildings at the Kearney institution. The Board of Control had the superintendent's residence in mind in submitting the estimate for that amount.

Superintendent Vanderville has been living with his wife and family in the administration building of the hospital with tubercular patients all around, and has protested to the board for the protection of his family.

Kaenigstein, former county attorney of Madison county, guilty of accepting bribes. The penalty is one to five years in the penitentiary on each count of the indictment. In the indictment there were four counts, and he was found guilty on each.

Kaenigstein resided in Norfolk, and it is charged that during 1914, upon each of four occasions, he received \$5 from the proprietors of the State Farm on the pretense of having the prosecution with the understanding that by paying the money the woman would be protected from arrest and prosecution under the provisions of the ordinance of the city.

VALUABLE ANIMALS KILLED BY STATE VETERINARIAN (From a Staff Correspondent.) LINCOLN, Oct. 4.—(Special.)—State Veterinarian J. D. Anderson has returned to Lincoln after superintending the killing in Hooker county last week of twenty "dourine" horses and two glandered horses.

Hooker county, with Blaine, Thomas, Cherry and Grant, have been quarantined on account of horse diseases since last October, but the first killing took place last week. Dr. Anderson expects to find a hundred or more infected animals and kill them immediately, so that the quarantine may be raised within a month.

The dourine horses were appraised, before being killed, at \$100.25, of which one-third, \$33.33, is paid by the state and another third by the federal government. The state pays two-thirds of the value of glandered horses, while the owner stands the remaining third.

Nebraska NEW PHONE INCORPORATION

Tri-State Telephone Company Organized Merging Northwest Nebraska Companies.

SAID TO BE INDEPENDENT LINES (From a Staff Correspondent.) LINCOLN, Oct. 4.—(Special.)—Articles of incorporation of the Tri-State Telephone company, a merger of the telephone companies of northwestern Nebraska and portions of Wyoming and South Dakota, were filed today with Secretary of State Pool.

The corporation is valued at \$250,000, and is backed by Evan B. Warner of Chadron, E. M. LeFang of Omaha and A. E. Grantham of Lexington. It will be independent of the Bell people, it is understood.

The scope of the new company extends from Valentine to Lusk, Wyo., and from Alliance to Ardmore, S. D. The matter of transferring the properties will be taken up later by the railway commission for approval.

Nebraska VALUABLE ANIMALS KILLED BY STATE VETERINARIAN

(From a Staff Correspondent.) LINCOLN, Oct. 4.—(Special.)—State Veterinarian J. D. Anderson has returned to Lincoln after superintending the killing in Hooker county last week of twenty "dourine" horses and two glandered horses.

Hooker county, with Blaine, Thomas, Cherry and Grant, have been quarantined on account of horse diseases since last October, but the first killing took place last week. Dr. Anderson expects to find a hundred or more infected animals and kill them immediately, so that the quarantine may be raised within a month.

The dourine horses were appraised, before being killed, at \$100.25, of which one-third, \$33.33, is paid by the state and another third by the federal government. The state pays two-thirds of the value of glandered horses, while the owner stands the remaining third.
