Gas and Smoke Wave Precedes British Dash

LONDON, Oct. 6.—Before attacking in their recent offensive, the British sent alternate waves of asphyxiating gas and dense smoke across the field, first releasing the gas for about ten minutes and then the smoke for a slightly shorter time, and repeating this procedure several times. It was impossible to see a tree twenty feet distant through the smoke clouds.

U. S. WILL BUILD TWO SUPER-DREADNOUGHTS

WASHINGTON, Oct. 6.—Secretary Daniels made it plain today that the navy building program, now in course of preparation, will include at least two super-dreadnaughts, each to cost \$15,000,000. "We have learned nothing from the 'European war,'" the secretary said, "that shakes our faith in these heavily armored ships as the main fighting line of the navy."
