

AUTOMOBILES CUT IN ON RAILROADS

More Strangers in Omaha During Big Carnival Days, but Railroads Haul Less.

MACHINES ARE BEYOND COUNT

While traffic officials of the steam and electric railroads assert that during the carnival season the number of strangers in the city has been far greater than during any former corresponding season, the revenue brought to the companies has been less than in any previous year.

For instance, during Wednesday, the day of the electrical parade, the street railway company as there were approximately 248,000 fares. This included the transportation of those who came and went from their homes on business, as well as those who came down in the evening to view the parade or to attend the Sunday meetings at the Tabernacle.

While the number of fares collected during the day looking back, during the corresponding day one year ago there were 272,000, or 24,000 more than this year. Notwithstanding the falling off in business, this year the street railway company maintained the best service in its history during any parade day and evening.
