Former Dewey Hotel Clerk Ends His Life After Love Trouble

Jease D. Noid, one of the heroes of the Dewey hotel fire of 1913, ended his life with a bullet last night in a room at the Overland hotel because of trouble with his sweetheart. Noid had been employed as manager of the Overland hotel, Thirteenth and Howard, up to three weeks ago. At the time of the fire he was night clerk at the hotel where half a dozen lodgers met death. At the time he was given credit for assisting the lives of many by bravely fighting the fire. A note, which was addressed to Miss Nelson, was found in the room. It read: "Dear Lydia—Please forgive me for this act. I had to save you from a life of misery and it was the only way out." Noid's father was the builder of the Windsor hotel, Twelfth and Macy, and in the early days was a prominent figure in Omaha's business and social life. The suicide also left instruction to notify a brother, L. J. Noid, at Latonia, O.
