Christ Hears Cry of Poor Man and Saves Him Out of Troubles

deeper and makes the probability that he will ever be saved just that much less, for the devil tightens his grip on a man every time he says no to Christ. To decide to hold on to sin another hour may mean that you will have to hold on forever.

It wasn't because the poor man of the text was the son of Jesse that God heard his cry. The fact that he had slain Goliath didn't give weight to his cry. His having been patient and forbearing with Saul didn't give any stress to his call upon God for help. It wasn't because he had killed the lion and the bear, or that he had put many of the king's enemies to death. Neither was it because he was great in ruling the land and commanding armies, or that he was gifted in writing poetry or in playing on the harp. When a cry goes up to the throne for God's help, it comes to a beggar just the same as it would to a king. There is no man so humble or sinful or ignorant, that God will not as surely hear his cry, when it comes from a penitent heart, as if he were one of the greatest and most gifted.

You say you are afraid you couldn't live a Christian life if you should undertake it. Think of David preferring to stay in the pit for fear he might fall in again. Think of a sick man not wanting to get well because he might get sick again! Or of a bankrupt refusing to pay 10 cents on the dollar because he couldn't pay a hundred.

If you can trust God to take you out of sin while you are in it, do you thing it will be any harder to trust him to keep you out of it after he gets you out? Because the Lord did something for the man of the text, count upon it that he will also do something for you. He is no respecter of persons, and is pledged to do for us what he has done for others. David was not only taken out of the pit in which he was lost, but he was put where he could travel with joy and comfort. The first thing that happens with every forgiven sinner is that he finds it a delight to do the Lord's will. It becomes a thousand times easier for him to live to please God than not to do it.

God Makes Road.
"He set my foot upon a rock and established my going." God always makes the road in which He wants his pilgrims to travel, and it is free from mire. The way is made for the man, and the man for the way, just as the locomotive is made for the rail and the rail for the locomotive. If we step where God tells us to step, though it may be a step in the dark, when our foot comes down we will find it on the rock. That is where David found himself as soon as he got out of the pit in which he couldn't even try to take a step without sinking deeper. He had a solid foundation under him, and knew where he was going. This is Christian experience, and is as good a description of what occurs today as of anything that happened in Bible times. Look at the two pictures and choose between them. One shows where sin puts a man, and the other what comes of seeking God in earnest. Look with pity upon the poor man who founders in the horrible pit, in which disgusting filth has been thrown, slowly and surely sinking in the filthy slime. This is what the devil does for those who serve him.

In contrast with this dark view, see the man whose feet have been taken out of the mire and planted on the rock. See him as he goes running and leaping on his way to the city that has foundations, and whose maker and builder is God. There is a song on his lips and a joy in his heart. Watch his face light up as he catches glimpses of the glorious place to which he is going. There can be no question as to which is the best off; the man in the mire or the man on the rock. There is only one sure way to be saved out of all trouble and that is to do as the man in the text did. It was the best thing he could do, and it is the best thing anybody in trouble can do. He cried to the Lord, and when a man gets to where he cries to the Lord he has reached a place where he is bound to get help. He has come to where he has stopped expecting help from any other source. Another thing about it is that when he cries to God he is willing to be saved in God's way, and when a man once gets there there is no trouble about his being saved. When we once get where we stop rejecting God's plan of salvation we are mighty close to God.

Makes Clean Sweep.
"The Lord saved him out of all his troubles." That's the way God does things. When He helps us He makes a clean sweep. He does as the good Samaritan did with the poor man on the Jericho road. He does all that is needed. "He saved him out of all his troubles," and Jesus came into the world especially to do this for each one of us—for you and for me. If the text read, "This poor man had a trouble and he cried unto the Lord, and the Lord heard him and saved him from it," it would be a great thing, but it might be very discouraging to some of us, for we might think, "Well, that man had only one trouble and I have many," or "My trouble is a great one and his may have been but a light one." But the words show that the man had many troubles, and this gives us all hope that we may also be saved from all our troubles. The cause of the man's troubles is not given, and this gives us all a chance to come in.

Sure Way Out.
The text is good news for all of us, for it tells us there is a sure way to get out of trouble, and there is not one of us who does not need the help that is offered. If the Lord helped one poor man out of all his troubles He will help every other poor man out of his troubles. You can't make anything else than this out of it. Verses of this kind were not put in the Bible simply to fill up, but to make a ladder upon which all may climb and find help. God wants us to know that, although we are in a world of trouble, there is a sure way of being delivered from it. We may go into the streets and cry about our troubles, and the people will rush on their mad way and pay no attention to us. We may go to the homes of our troubles, and try to tell them about our troubles, only to have the doors closed in our faces. We may walk the streets until we drop to the ground exhausted, trying to find some willing ear into which to pour our troubles, and nobody will listen to us. But God is never too busy in making words that He cannot hear the cry of the poor man who calls

to Him in his trouble. He will hear and He will help. Believe it and try Him. Take courage and trust Him. God is always the same—yesterday, today and forever, and what He did for one poor man yesterday, He will do for every other poor man today, and if I didn't believe it I wouldn't be doing what I am now. I would never preach another sermon if I didn't feel sure that He whose I am and whom I serve would do this very thing. He has promised to do it as plainly as language can express it and multitudes of people can testify from their own experience that this is true. No matter what your troubles are, or how many they are, cry to Him as the poor man of the text did, and help will come quick and sure. Don't you remember how easy it was to get help from mother when you cried to her? Well, God has a heart like a mother, and must help those who cry to Him. (Copyright by William A. Sunday.)

Twelve Bishops of Episcopal Church Coming to Omaha

The synod of the Province of the Northwest of the Episcopal church will meet in Omaha October 23 to 25. This province comprises the various dioceses and missionary districts within the states of Minnesota, Iowa, Nebraska, Colorado, South Dakota, North Dakota, Montana and Wyoming.

Twelve bishops are expected to be present, along with upwards of 100 clerical and lay delegates from the various dioceses. Arrangements have been made for meeting all of the visiting delegates at the station by members of the local churches, and rooms have been engaged at various hotels in the city for all of the visitors.

On Sunday, October 25, the bishops who are in attendance will be the special preachers at the different Omaha churches.

On Wednesday noon of this week the members of the different local committees who have charge of the arrangements for the synod met for organization at the University club and outlined their plan of work.
