"He set my foot upon a rock and established my going." God always makes the road in which He wants his pilgrims to travel, and it is free from mire. The way is made for the man, and the man for the way, just as the locomotive is made for the rail and the rail for the locomotive. If we step where God tells us to step, though it may be a step in the dark, when our foot comes down we will find it on the rock. That is where David found himself as soon as he got out of the pit in which he couldn't even try to take a step without sinking deeper. He had a solid foundation under him, and knew where he was going. This is Christian experience, and is as good a description of what occurs today as of anything that happened in Bible times. Look at the two pictures and choose between them. One shows where sin puts a man, and the other what comes of seeking God in earnest. This is what the devil does for those who serve him.

The func-There is a song on his lips and great joy in his heart. Watch his face light up as he catches glimpees of the glorious place to which he is going. There can be no question as to which is the best off; the man in the mire or the man on the rock. There is only one sure way to be saved laid and polished. out of all trouble and that is to do as the man in the text did. It was the best thing he could do, and it is the best thing anybody in trouble can do. He cried to the Lord, and when a man gets to where he cries to the Lord he has reached a place where he is bound to get help. He has come to where he has stopped expecting help from any other source. God he is willing to be saved in God's way, and when a man once gets there there is no trouble about his being saved, When we once get where we stop rejecting God's plan of salvation we are mighty close to God. Makes Clean Sweep. "The Lord saved him out of all his

troubles." That's the way God does things. When He helps us He makes a clean sweep. He does as the good Samaritan did with the poor man on the Jericho road. He does all that is needed. "He saved him out of all his troubles," and Jesus came into the world especially to do this for each one of us-for you and for me. If the text read, "This poor man had a trouble and he cried unto the Lord, and the Lord heard him and saved him from it," it would be a great thing, but it might be very discouraging to some of us, for we might think, "Well, that man had only one trouble and I have many," or "My trouble is a great one and his

may have been but a light one." But the words show that the man had many troubles, and this gives us all hope that we may also be saved from all our troubles. The cause of the man's troubles is not given, and this gives us all a chance to

Sure Way Out. The text is good news for all of us,

for it tells us there is a sure way to

get out of trouble, and there is not one of us who does not need the help that is offered. If the Lord helped one poor man out of all his troubles He will help every other poor man out of his troubles. You can't make anything else than this out of it. Verses of this kind were not put in the Bible simply to fill up, but to make a ladder upon which all may climb and find help. God wants us to know that, although we are in a world of trouble, there is a sure troubles, and the people will rush on their mad way and pay no attention to us. We may go to the homes of the wealthy and try to tell them about our troubles, only to have the doors closed in our faces. We may walk the streets until we drop to the ground exhausted, trying to find some willing ear into which to pour our troubles, and nobody will listen to us. But God is never too busy in making worlds that He cannot hear the cry of the poor man who calls

to Him in his trouble. He will hear and He will help. Believe it and try Him-Take courage and trust Him. God is always the same-yesterday, today and forever, and what He did for one poor man yesterday He will do for every other poor man today, and if I didn't be-lieve it I wouldn't be doing what I am now. I would never preach another sermon if I didn't feel sure that He whose he will ever be saved just that much I am and whom I serve would do this very thing. He has promised to do man every time he says no to Christ. as plainly as language can express it. To decide to hold on to sin another and multitudes of people can testify from their own experience that this is true No matter what your troubles are, how many they are, cry to Him as the poor man of the text did, and help will come quick and sure.
