CHICAGO GRAIN AND PROVISIONS

Features of the Trading and Closing Prices on Board of Trade.

CHICAGO, Oct. 12.—Higher receipts at Minneapolis, Duluth and Winnipeg, with a promised continued heavy movement in the northwest throughout the week did a good deal today to depress the wheat market here.

Wheat prices headed down grade right at the start and failed to make a decided rally after subsequent news. Many stop-loss orders were uncovered, all the prospect of favorable weather gave special emphasis to the big arrivals at the chief spring terminals.

Particular had a surprising exhibit, more than ten times as many carloads being received as on the corresponding day of the year ago. The total at Minneapolis and Duluth was nearly tripled. Bulls here were thus threatened for the first time since they were driven from the market.
