FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CORNERSTONE LAID

More Than Five Hundred Persons Attend Services Which Mark Advance in Building.

SUNDAY DELIVERS A SERMON

"We lay this cornerstone in the name of Jesus Christ," declared Rev. E. H. Jenks as the big block of stone settled on the foundation of the new First Presbyterian church at Thirty-fourth and Farnam streets.

More than 500 persons attended the services which marked the culminating rites of the initial steps in the building of the new edifice. Rev. W. A. Sunday delivered an address and said, in part: "I don't like to talk out of doors, nor do I have to, but on an occasion like this I am only too glad to speak. This laying of the cornerstone is a milestone in your progress and a jewel in the crown of Christ. Whenever I go into a city and see small, cramped churches, it causes me to believe that the spirit of their religion is cramped and the pursuit of its congregation is the same condition."

"Here you have a magnificent tribute to the Lord, and see that it is such. I don't give two whoops for a minister that detracts one iota from the scriptural doctrines of Jesus Christ. I would rather do to hell preaching His word as it is given, than to leave out any part, so as to compromise with those who declare they cannot swallow it whole. Stick by your minister; that is the spirit, and make your church an evangelical one."

Should be Open to Everybody. "Don't make it a place of amusement for a set, but open to everyone, rich or poor, wise or simple. And you will have a church that is truly a house of God and the Lord our Savior. I hope that the electric lights will symbolize the spiritual light that will illuminate the hearts of the hypocrites. And I guess you have them. If you haven't you're different from any church I ever saw. Don't compromise religion with anyone—remember that the doctrines of Christianity are in direct opposition to the belief of the worldly world. And fight for your church and the stand it takes in spreading the doctrines of the Lord. I thank you for inviting me here and am glad I came. Now I'm going back to bed."

The laying of the stone was done by Rev. E. H. Jenks and Robert Dempster. The depositing of the metal box, containing the church records, in the cornerstones was the work of H. A. Doud. Prayer by Rev. A. B. Marshall, the benediction by Rev. M. V. Higbee and the invocation by Rev. R. L. Wheeler of the First Presbyterian church of South Omaha, were a part of the program. James H. Adams read the psalm and Rev. J. J. Sams bestowed the benediction. John C. Wharton, N. H. Loomis and Robert Dempster spoke briefly.

Stubborn Fighting on the Riga and Along Milan Road

PETROGRAD, Oct. 21. (Via London, Oct. 20.)—The war office today made public the following communication: "In the region of Riga there has been stubborn fighting along nearly the entire line. "On the Axa river, below Mitau, the Germans have succeeded in copying the village of Kich. On the Milan road, northwest of Mitau, the fighting continues. The artillery firing was noticeably increasing on this front. In the wooded region, north of the Mitau-Neugutwy, the Germans have succeeded in advancing to the north. Everywhere in this region terrific fighting is going on. "Enemy artillery yesterday opened fire against the Eisenhof-Temmlow railway at a point northwest of Friedriehstadt. Our battle planes yesterday dropped at least fifty bombs on Mitau, Gross Eikau and Neugut, on establishments behind the German front. "In the region of Duckern village, south of Jeebstadt, we had the advantage in engagements with the Germans. "In the region of Dvinsk there is heavy artillery fighting at some points. On the front of Lakes Demmen and Drevelinty and to the south as far as the Priepel region, there is no change in the situation. "The successes reported yesterday in the region of the middle Sty river have been brilliantly developed by our troops. In the fighting near the Zallidine farm, north of Hatalovka, we captured numerous prisoners and many machine guns. The town of Csartoryak was taken by our sudden attack in force. "Turning simultaneously both flanks of the Germans operating in this district, we took as prisoners more than 700 soldiers of the First Kronprinz Grenadier regiment with twenty-eight officers. The town of Csartoryak was taken by our sudden attack in force. "On the Sty above Csartoryak the Germans and Austrians have been put to flight by a renewal of our vigorous attack. We carried by assault the villages of Budka and Rudnia, capturing numerous prisoners and machine guns, the exact number of which has not yet been ascertained. "According to later reports the number of prisoners taken Monday near Novo Belki included two entire companies of the Forty-first German infantry regiment with their officers. "Determined hand-to-hand fighting near the village of Komarova and the Gley farm, on the left bank of the Sty above Novo Belki and near the village of Boguslawka, northwest of Deramo, resulted to our advantage. "The smoothness of our operations and the successful results attained are shown by the fact that a body of our troops yesterday took prisoners fifty officers and 1,900 men and captured six machine guns and a great quantity of arms and munitions abandoned by the enemy, all with the loss of one officer and fifty soldiers."

CHICAGO, Ill., Oct. 20.—Claims totaling \$470,000 against the St. Joseph-Chicago Steamship company and the Indiana Transportation company for the deaths of forty-one persons and the injury of six others in the Eastland disaster were filed in the United States district court here today. Charles Haffke, deputy county attorney, who recently resigned, is about to abandon the business of a lawyer for that of a farmer.

Three thousand acres is the size of the J.B. which he will direct. Grandview plantation is the name of the farm. It is located in Hemstead county, Arkansas. It is under the management of a company of which Mr. Haffke is an officer.
