

BISHOPS WANT TO KEEP SECRETARY

Decide Money for Salary and Expenses is Well Spent by the Synod.

GIVES STRENGTH TO CHURCH

A warm argument on the question of retaining the provincial secretary marked the morning session of the Episcopal synod of the Province of the Northwest.

There are many in the province who believed that this officer could be dispensed with, thus saving the \$3,000 salary and the \$1,000 required for his expenses.

Several of the bishops spoke and all of them favored keeping both the office and the man now filling it, Rev. Dr. C. C. Rollit.

Bishop Tyler of North Dakota struck a humorous note in the discussion when he said:

"I was so much bothered by a flood of letters from traveling secretaries when I first became bishop of North Dakota that I felt like asking the board to appoint a missionary to take care of my correspondence and I wanted to put half of 'em right out of their jobs. Dr. Rollit, however, has left me beautifully alone. I hope that we will vote unreservedly, simultaneously, unanimously and tumultuously to retain the office and to retain Dr. Rollit in it."

More Than Money.

Bishop Beecher made a strong speech in favor of it and the venerable Bishop Brewer of Montana, who was presiding at the meeting, took the floor and pointed out that the dioceses in which the secretary worked during the last year had contributed \$1,000 more than they did the year before, thus proving the secretary's efficiency from the financial standpoint.
