

GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

Wheat is Very Strong, Advancing Three Cents and Some Even Selling at One Dollar.

CORN AND OATS ALSO RALLY

OMAHA, October 29, 1915. The wheat market was very strong today, most of the wheat selling 3 cents higher, while a few sales were reported at an advance of only 1/2 cent.

Corn was quoted 1/4 cent higher to 1/2 cent lower, the yellow corn commanding the premium, while the mixed and white corn was unchanged to 1/2 cent lower.

Oats were unchanged to 1 cent lower, but most of the sales were 1/2 cent under yesterday's prices.

Clearances: Wheat and flour equal to 1,000,000 bu., corn, 11,000 bu., and oats, 11,000 bu.

Liverpool closed with wheat unchanged to 1/4 higher and corn unchanged.

DUN'S REVIEW OF TRADE

SENTIMENT GREATLY IMPROVED

NEW YORK, Oct. 29.—Dun's Review of Trade tomorrow will say: Not only is there no step backward in general business, but each week the pendulum of progress swings over a wider area and confidence is further strengthened.

Recent vagaries of the weather have not been conducive to the best results in retail distribution, yet substantial gains are nevertheless apparent in this direction.

The forward movement gathers momentum in spite of various opposing influences such as the instability of foreign exchange, the concentration of freight at terminals, and the continued dislocation in the ranks of labor, and while expansion is still most pronounced in war order lines, on the whole conditions and prospects are much less checkered and irregular than formerly.

Few discordant notes mar the cheerful tone of reports from the leading centers and traders and since popular impressions largely control the market, the notable improvement in sentiment has an important bearing upon the future trend of affairs.

No one now doubts that the brighter day has definitely dawned, but change of spirit finds expression in the launching of many deferred undertakings, while more new enterprises are being started than for several years past.

Instead of the marked hesitancy and caution previously manifested, large projects are conceived and carried into effect in a manner that attests the increased confidence pervading the commercial world.
