On the other hand the general market on steers and heifers is fully as active for the week, the market being carried down by liberal receipts, moderate country prices and the decline in beef cattle...

HOGS—There was a fair Saturday run on hogs and as a result from other points were not very numerous...

For the week prices are around 20c lower. The price of hogs is down 20c downward all week, and while prices held firm on a couple of days there was no noticeable advance at any time...

At the opening of the week a fairly good run was seen and the general market was strong to a fine better and since that time has continued on that basis...

Trade in feeders was active pretty much the same as in the case of hogs, being strong and possibly a little higher during the forepart of the week...

Feeders were heavy in good demand with the bulk of the good ones going at \$3.50, with a few up to \$4.25. Common kinds have been neglected and had to sell at \$2.50...
