ATTEMPT MADE TO MURDER VILLA

Would-Be Assassin is Executed After Making Confession to American Consul.

IMPLICATES GENERAL GONZALES

Said He Was Paid Large Sum of Money in Mexico City by General Villa's Strongest Opponent—Incriminating Letter.

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The would-be assassin, Francisco I. Mugia, was executed after making a confession before George G. Carothers, the American consular agent.

The accusation caused much excitement. The telegram from Villa's secretary said Mugia was apprehended at Guadalupe, where Villa, with his troops, has been awaiting the outcome of the conference.

The official report stated that the prisoner just prior to his execution had told the Villa officials in the presence of Carothers that he had been paid a large sum of money by General Gonzalez at Mexico City. In his possession was found incriminating evidence and a loaded pistol.

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The accused was an Argentine subject. It was Mugia who assassinated a German consular official at Mexico City some years ago.

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RAILROAD MAN KILLED BY FARMER IN DISPUTE

PIERRE, S. D., Oct. 25.—(Special Telegram.)—Station Agent O. C. Hunter of the Chicago & Northwestern railway at Midland, fifty miles west of here, was shot and killed late this evening by A. P. Heim, a farmer with whom he had a dispute.

Deputy Sheriff Norman of Stanley county had just stepped out of the station and was on the platform when the shot was fired and immediately placed Heim under arrest.

BOWMAN FOUND GUILTY OF FIRST DEGREE MURDER

YANKTON, S. D., Oct. 27.—(Special Telegram.)—Charles F. N. Bowman, on trial for his life for killing Nellie Brewer July last, was found guilty of murder by the jury and the penalty fixed at life imprisonment at hard labor. The jury took the case at 6 p. m., spent an hour at supper, and within fifteen minutes on return to the jury room was ready to report.

The murder of Nellie Brewer, a Yankton High school girl, with whom Bowman was infatuated, occurred July 2 last. Bowman's defense was that he shot the girl accidentally while in an epileptic fit.
