

# BRITISH SEA LORD RESIGNS HIS OFFICE

Newspaper Campaign Against High Official of Austrian Birth Causes Removal.

RECEIVED IN AUDIENCE BY KING

Related by Marriage to Prussian Prince Holding High Position in German Navy—No Open Charges Against Him.

**BULLETIN.**  
LONDON, Oct. 30.—The Times says that it understands that Baron Fisher, admiral of the fleet, will succeed Prince Louis of Battenberg as first sea lord of the admiralty.

LONDON, Oct. 30.—Prince Louis of Battenberg, against whom there have been no open charges, but much idle gossip because of his Austrian origin, has resigned his position as first sea lord of the admiralty. It is thought probable because of a newspaper campaign against his holding such a high command.

Announcement of Prince Louis' resignation was made tonight in the court circular, which recorded that the prince had received in audience by the king on relinquishing his appointment.

Prince Louis of Battenberg although born in Austria, came to England as a boy and was naturalized in 1865 when he was only 11 years old. His rise in the navy was slower than that of most cadets for he had been in the navy twenty-three years before he was promoted to a captaincy and it was another thirteen years before he became a rear admiral. Even after that he went up by easy stages, but finally his great ability and services being recognized, he was appointed first sea lord in 1912—a few years after his visit to America.

Outside of the fact that he was born in Austria the chief argument his opponents made against him was that he is the brother-in-law of Prince Henry of Prussia, who holds a somewhat similar command in the German navy.

There were rumors sometime ago that Prince Louis had been confined in the tower of London. They were too ridiculous to be given serious consideration, although the authorities deemed it expedient that he should appear more in public instead of confining himself to the admiralty, where since the outbreak of the war he had been working night and day directing the strategy of the navy, the prince being considered one of the most noted strategists of the navy.

He is a vice admiral and personal aide-camp to the king. He was born at Graz, Austria, in 1854, the eldest son of Prince Alexander of Hesse. He married his cousin, Princess Victoria, daughter of Louis IV, grand duke of Hesse, and of Princess Alice, Queen Victoria's daughter. He was naturalized a British subject and entered the royal navy in 1868.

By marriage Prince Louis is related to Emperor William of Germany, the emperor being the eldest son of Queen Victoria's eldest daughter. The wife of Prince Louis is sister to the Russian empress and cousin of the German emperor. In 1908 he visited the United States in command of a British squadron.

## Bomb from German Aeroplane Kills Nineteen Women

LONDON, Oct. 30.—Two German aeroplanes on Wednesday dropped two bombs at Bethune, France, according to the correspondent of the Daily Mail in northern France. The first failed to explode, but the second, which fell among market women, killed nineteen of them and injured forty others.

Two bombs were also dropped at Dunkirk on the same day from a Zeppelin machine, 5,000 feet up in the air. A woman and child were killed and all the windows in the neighborhood were smashed. The women of the town are terrified.

No single unit as powerful as either the Greek or the British, but the number of its vessels, it is argued in London, will give it command of the inland sea.

The state of Albania considered a masterpiece of the diplomacy of the great powers, has effectively disproved the theories that it was a compact nation by revealing itself into several separate governments, some of which are nothing more than independent municipalities.

The disrupted European concert is represented at Avlona by Italy and by four warring communities, with no government to accept their advice. Greece has invaded northern Epirus and complacently announced that its action has met with the approval of the powers. In the north Esad Pasha, representing Turkey, evidently is preparing to occupy the unstable throne recently deserted by Prince William of Wied.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 30.—Constitutionality of the white slave law, when applied to instances not involving coercion or price, was raised in the supreme court today in an application for reconsideration of the court's refusal to review the conviction of Max G. Cohen, an attorney for Portland, Ore., for alleged subornation of perjury in a white slave case.

## Rates from North Here Are Suspended

WASHINGTON, Oct. 30.—(Special Telegram)—The Interstate Commerce commission further suspended from November 12 until May 1, 1915, the operation of tariffs containing proposed increased rates on live stock, carloads, between points in South Dakota and other states and St. Paul, Omaha and Kansas City.

## End of Turkey in Europe.

The Times commenting today on its Petrograd dispatches reporting the Turkish bombardment of peaceful sea-coast towns, says:

"The situation on the near east has developed logically. For some weeks past the influence controlling the Ottoman government have been working to provoke the allies into declaring war on Turkey. These efforts have been in vain as the allied powers were determined not to be the aggressors.

"They met acts of provocation, like the incorporation of the German citizens in Brest and in the Turkish navy, and the abolition of the capitulations, merely by protests. Then a sort of ultimatum was addressed to England regarding the watch kept upon the mouth of the Dardanelles. This also failed, but finally the Turks began a military demonstration against the Egyptian frontier, but they found all preparations made for an attack.

"Now comes the bombardment of the Russian towns. It is believed that the sultan and some of his advisors favor a policy of neutrality, but that they have been overruled by the executive of union and progress which is best way.

"Great numbers of Turkish troops are supposed to be massed along the Russian frontier where the problem of feeding them must be arduous. To the south the Ottoman forces are believed to be entrenched through southern Syria and
