OMAHA MAN HEAD OF FIELD HOSPITAL

Dr Karl Connell to Organize Advance Division of American Hospital Ambulance.

GIVES EARLY SURGICAL AID

Has Large Corps of Assistants to Operate on Wounded Men at the Front Who Usually Die. in Transportation.

Dr. Karl Connell, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. Connell of this city, now surgeon of the Rossevelt hospital of New York City, Wednesday of this week sails on the Lusitania for Paris, where he will organize and take charge of an advanced division of the American hospital ambulance. He takes with him four surgeons, ten assistants and fifteen nurses. The hospital is to be provided with several hundred beds for desperate operative cases, requiring immediate attention and those of the class that now die in transportation.

This required early surgical aid will be given by the American surgeons and their assistants to all the injured, regardless of whether they are Germans, English, French or Belgians. An appropriation of \$350,000 has been made for carrying on this work.

Has Had Great Experience. Dr. Connell was selected for this work by reason of his recognized ability and extensive hospital experience. He has served as both house surgeon and house physician in the New York hospital and for the last two years has been the chief operating surgeon at the Roosevelt hos

Although but M years of age, Dr. Con nell has come to be looked upon as one of the leading surgeons of the United States OFFICIALS OF NEW and has performed hundreds of operations that other surgeons have considered too difficult to attempt. He is an Omaha boy, born and reared here, graduated from the Omaha High school and the from the New York Hospital of Surgeons, having served the full term in the last named institution.

In the Omaha High school Dr. Connell was one of the most active of the students. He was the second captain of the eadets, his brother Ralph, his senior, having been the first. He is unmarried.


