DEMAND FOR LABORERS BIG

Farmers Are Calling for Help to Husk Big Corn Crop.

TRYING TO BEAT OUT WINTER

Wages High and Laborers Scarce in Nebraska as Well as Neighboring Corn Growing States.

Not in years, say railroad men and labor agency managers, has there been such a demand for laborers on Nebraska farms as at the present time.

In Other States, Too.

What is true in Nebraska with reference to a shortage of men in the corn fields is also said to maintain in Iowa and Kansas, where a big crop is waiting to be gathered.

The Nebraska corn yield is estimated at twenty-six bushels, the state over, which, according to the record kept by the freight department, is the best in ten years, with one exception.

Not only is there a great demand for corn pickers in all portions of Nebraska, but there is a good demand for farm laborers in other lines.

Then, too, all through the state farmers are taking on additional help in order to get ready for winter.

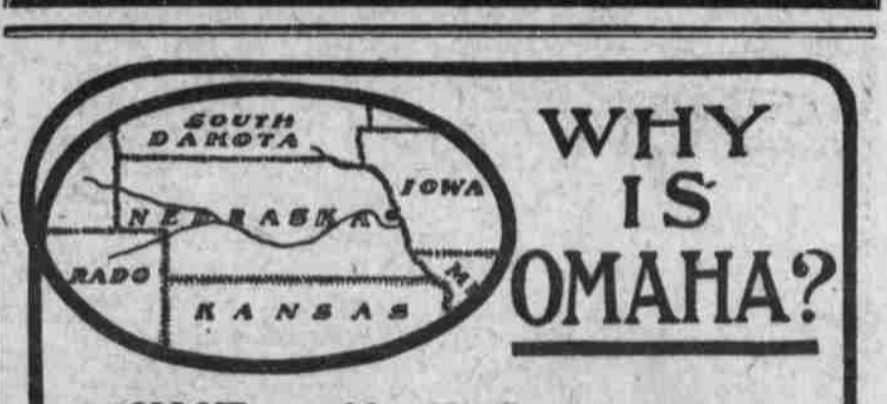
