MAGS WORKING FOR PEACE

American and Federal League Chiefs Seeking Agreement.

A. L. OWNERS MEET IN CHICAGO

None of Officials Will Venture Prediction of Conditions Likely to Be Basis of Settlement.

CHICAGO, Nov. 5.—With peace in the base ball world and a possible change in the ownership of the New York club up for discussion, officials of the American league went into annual session here today behind closed doors. Routine business was disposed of at the directors' meeting, which preceded the league meeting.

Some of the magnates frankly disapproved of the events which led to the resignation of Frank Chance as manager of the New York club, and it was said plans for a shift of ownership of that club would be laid before the meeting.

Declare for Peace. The league officials generally declared themselves for peace today, but none would venture a prediction of conditions under which peace might be made with the Federal league. One or two said they hoped a truce might be agreed upon to prevent "crazy" bidding for ball players in competition between organized base ball and the Federal league.
