Disputch from Athens Announces that English Destroyer Has Cantured Two Turkish Sailing Vessels.

VALPARAISO, Chile, Nov. 12 -- A rumor has been circulated here to the effect that the British battleship, Canopus, has sunk off Coronel. This report is officially denied by the Chilean admiralty.

Gunbont Sunk. LONDON, Nov. 12 - The little British torpedo gunboat Niger, which was built twenty-two years ago and has been used as a tender, is the latest victim of a German submarine. It was torpedoed yesterday merning in the Downs, north of the Straits of Dover, and foundered immediately. The officers and crew were

The admiralty in announcing the loss of the ship says:

'The Niger, Lieutenant Commander Arthur T. Muir, was torpedoed this morning (November ii) in the Downs. All the officers and seventy-seven of the crew were saved.

Four men were injured. It is thought that there was no loss of life." The Niger has been employed in semi-

Sunk Off Deal River. A dispatch to the Exchange Telegraph company from Deal says:

The Niger was sunk off Deal pler. An explosion was heard and the yearel disappeared within fifteen minutes. Boats were immediately sent out to search for the crew, one reaching the spot in time to rescue forty men, while the Niger was sinking. Other boats rescued the remainder of the crew and landed them on Deal beach."

The Niger carried a complement o eighty-five men. The gunboat was built in 1892. It had a displacement of \$10 tons and was 230 feet long. Its armament consisted of two 4.7-inch guns, four three pounders, one machine gun, and three eighteen-inch torpedo tubes. Its speed, when it was built, was 19.2 knots per hour.

Turkish Ships Taken. PARIS, Nov. 12.-The following dispatch has been received by the Havas agency from Athens:

"It is announced that a British destroyer has captured two Turkish sailing ships near Tenedos.

The town of Berat, Albania, has been pillaged and completely destroyed. Anarchy reigns at Aviona, Albania. Partisans of Kemal Bey to the number of 1,500 forced the governor to haul down the Turkish flag and hoist the Albanian colors. Essad Pasha sent 500 soldiers to Aviona and they disarmed the inhabitants and restored the Turkish flag.

JAPANESE PAPERS SINKS IN DOWNS INSULT WHITE MEN

Teutons While Allies Cringe in Background.

Heavy Artillery Being Shipped Across Siberia to Poland, According to Story of London Correspondent.

LONDON, Nov. 12.-(Special Cablegram LONDON, Nov. 11 .- (Special Cablegram New York World and Omaha Bee.)-A Daily News correspondent, who has just arrived in London from Port Arthur, SHVE:

The war is greatly regretted by foreigners, as it has resulted in a flood of scurrilous Japanese cartoons and denunciations showing the lowest respect for white men. The Japanese newspapers leave no doubt in the minds of their readers that Japan is wuging and fighting war against the Teutone, while Britain, Russia and France cringe thankfully in the background.

"In Vizdivostok there was a great uroil over the dispatch of 60,000 soldiers to the westward. Every German of the extensive Teutonic colony already had been shipped west to the prison campa.

Japanese Guns Cross Asia.

"I have obtained corroborations from two persons of an account given me of the passage of a quantity of Japanese heavy artillery in charge of Japanese officers over the trans-Siberian railway to Poland. Considerable secrecy was observed. At least two and possibly more long trains of Japanese guns have gone

"One passenger train, consisting of half a mile of cars, left daily for the west. being hauled at a snail's pace by an antiquated locomotive, all the good locomotives in Siberia having been requisitioned for service in Russian Poland and an extraordinary collection of Belgian, German, Russian and American locomo tives is attempting to cope with the
