FIERCE FIGHTING RENEWED ON AISNE

Line from L'Aigle Past Soissons and Rheims to Argonne Bristling with Reincarnated Activity.

HEAVY FIGHTING AT DIXMUDE Possession of Place Great Advantage to Germans and Allies Are Seeking to Root Teutons from Position.

LONDON, Nov. 13.—The correspondent of the Times in France, under date of Tuesday, sends the following regarding the fighting on the Aisne:

"The battle of the Aisne, to which the official communications now refer as the center of the allies' line, has been renewed this week with its original intensity from the forest of L'Aigle, past Soissons and Rheims to the Argonne."

"On the whole the allies have the advantage. The French capture of Quenoy-en-Santerre was a good deal bigger affair than reported. On the other hand, the enemy's accounts of a great victory at Vailly were exaggerated. They obtained a temporary advantage, but the allies have more than regained the original positions. It was here that one of the French gunners, who refused to join the retreat until his ammunition was expended, succeeded in killing 900 Germans with his last twelve shells while the enemy was advancing. The gunner finally succeeded in retreating with a slight wound while the enemy was only 100 yards away."

Nibble at Entrenchments. "All along the center the allies are nibbling at the German entrenchments. As in the previous fighting along the Aisne certain localities seem as surely destined to be the scene of continuous fighting as it is to be the battle place for later. Many of these hills, quarries and plateaus, which have been the scene of desperate fighting throughout the last few weeks, were the scenes of similar fighting in the war of the Gaul and in the Napoleonic wars."

Just Two Points for Teutons. "The Times Flanders' correspondent, describing the German attack at Dixmude, says: 'They were only two points, Dixmude and Nieupoort, where the Germans could assume the offensive on the Yser, all the front between being impossible for fighting on account of the flood. The force concentrated between Dixmude and Nieupoort was chosen for the attack. In the morning the German batteries opened a heavy fire on the French positions and kept it up through most of the day. This cannonade was the prelude to a violent infantry attack on the outskirts of Dixmude. The attack was made with great gallantry and very heavy fighting took place. The Germans came on in overwhelming numbers and toward evening the allies were compelled to retire. They fell back into the town, destroying the two bridges in their retreat. The Germans thus won the bridgehead.'"

Both Sides Reinforced. "Next morning strong reinforcements were brought up by both sides and fighting continued in and about the town. In the course of the afternoon a force of Germans succeeded in penetrating into the town and a desperate struggle went on in the streets. The capture of Dixmude or a part of it would be of great advantage to the Germans at Dixmude is very important, surrounded by water. More than once Dixmude has proved a death trap to the Germans and it may well be so again."

"The correspondent of the Daily Mail in northern France telegraphing under date of Wednesday adds that the German attack on Dixmude is very serious; that the Germans are exhausted by their exertions and will probably be driven out again. Evidence is accumulating, according to this correspondent that the Germans are suffering from a shortage of ammunition and that the quality of their artillery and ammunition appears to have deteriorated. Heavy fighting, he says, continues around Dixmude."

Cattle Die Suddenly. LINDSAY, Neb., Nov. 13.—(Special.)—Chris Schaefer, two miles north of here, lost thirteen head of cattle this week. He turned them out in the stocks, apparently well and in less than twenty-four hours after getting sick they died.

either as to its entirety or as to any department thereof.

Governor to Appoint Officials. "The constitution provides for the election of an auditor, secretary and treasurer of state, but does not specifically define their duties. Our plan of reorganization contemplates concentration of authority in one head—the governor of the state—and to accomplish this end it is necessary that the governor be vested with authority to appoint the various officials through whom he must carry out his policy. We would, therefore, leave to the secretary of state the reporting part of the state's affairs, to the auditor the accounting part of the state's business and to the treasurer the handling of the state's revenues, just as was originally contemplated when the constitution was adopted and before successive legislatures placed numerous departments of administration under these officials.

"We hope and believe that through this system greater efficiency and economy will result by combining certain boards and abolishing others; but have not entered upon a specific discussion of that feature at this time, leaving that field for later consideration.

"By this policy we would restore these officials to the status contemplated originally, with the purpose ultimately of abolishing those offices by constitutional amendment, at such time transferring their remaining powers and duties to the officials to be, how referred to. This would not only concentrate authority in the governor as the appointing power, eliminating division of authority at present prevailing, but would shorten a now badly encumbered ballot, thus making for a simplified government.

Divisions of Departments. "We would divide the various departments of the state's activities into three great divisions with a head or chief of each division to be appointed by the governor, and to have general supervision over the several departments placed under him. Instead of each department being left to pursue its own course, wholly or substantially independent of all other departments, all would be welded together in co-ordinate activity, minor department heads under the great department leader, the three department leaders laboring together and all in co-operation with the governor as the supreme head, becoming in fact the cabinet of the governor and responsive to his policies.

"We have designated these three divisions as department of social progress, department of industries and department of public safety. We have listed as one of the subdivisions the railroad commission, and we do this because we believe

that the membership of that commission should be appointed by the governor in furtherance of the short ballot, and also efficient concentration of administrative authority and responsibility. The attorney general should also be appointed by the governor.

"While the following scheme of department division is not necessarily absolute—perhaps the best interests of the state may be more completely served by further revision—it is the judgment of the committee that substantially the following readjustment will be found most efficient:

business as now prevails could be avoided by unity of operation and management. The number of regular clerks could be materially reduced, especially by having a few general clerks to serve wherever the state's business may require temporary extra help. Heads of minor departments should be guided by a general system of regulation. Authority, and with it responsibility for success or failure, would be centered—the chief of the division to the head of the great department of which that division formed a part, the department head to the governor and the governor to the people, and thus will a government most responsive to the will of the people be secured. Much more may be said, but the foregoing is sufficient for present purposes.

"The head of every division of the state's activities should make a careful, complete and definite statement of the needs of his department for the ensuing biennial period, showing also in parallel columns the amount granted for the same purposes during the preceding period, and showing also the use made of the previous grant, its sufficiency, inadequacy, etc."

"In conclusion permit us to say that it is our intention to supplement this report with a full presentation of the matters here briefly suggested, same to be printed and distributed to every member of the general assembly as well as to the public. In the meantime, making this preliminary report public we invite all interested persons who may have helpful ideas upon the matters here presented to give us the benefit thereof, as our one sole object is to accomplish real good for our state, and out of such suggestions there may develop much of good."

The report is signed by the entire membership of the committee, ten in all.

Billion More Asked for British War Chest

LONDON, Nov. 13.—The announcement of the introduction into Parliament of a measure to vote a credit of \$25,000,000 (\$1,150,000,000) was issued officially this afternoon. The money is intended to cover the naval and military expenditures which may be incurred before March 31 and all expenditures which may be necessary or desirable to meet trade or other abnormal conditions created by the war. This sum, added to the previous credits voted by Parliament, brings the total of credits to \$225,000,000 (\$1,025,000,000).

FATHER OF BRIDE RESISTS BELLIGERENT CHARIVARIERS

SHENANDOAH, Ia., Nov. 13.—(Special.)—The bride's father, Frank Deal, who was brought into court on a charge of disturbing the peace when he had a hand-to-hand combat with a charivari party following the wedding of his daughter to Herbert H. Thomas of Des Moines, Tuesday night, was freed of the charge before Judge Castle yesterday afternoon. Testimony showed that the members of the money-making party had thrown a bucket of water in his face when he came out to protest with them, and had also stuffed his mouth full of mud to prevent his cries of help. He hit Lou Aldrich in the head with a stick causing a painful injury. The latter claimed to have been merely a passer-by and had the father arrested.
