

GIVES CHILDREN FREEDOM

Montessori System Does Not Harness Youngsters to Conventionality.

PROF. W. N. HALSEY SPEAKS

University of Omaha Educator Believes Students Should Be Given Freedom to Develop Natural Propensities.

Mothers crowded the large home of Mrs. A. D. Duns Thursday afternoon to learn something of the Montessori system of child training, as expounded by Prof. Walter N. Halsey of the University of Omaha and Miss Frances Todd, who spent nine months at the New York Montessori school.

Prof. Halsey said that the Montessori system was opposed to anything that savored of method, discipline or conventionality and advocated absolute freedom for the child.

An additional meeting will be called to discuss the possibility of bringing a director, who has been trained under Madame Montessori in Rome, to take charge of a school in Omaha.
