

REPUBLICANS TELL EXPENSE

Make Public Summary of Financial Condition After Campaign.

DEBT OF SEVENTEEN HUNDRED

List of Contributors to Funds is Published, Showing Who Furnished Revenues for Campaign in Nebraska.

LINCOLN, Neb., Nov. 17.—(Special Telegram)—With \$11 in the treasury to pay an outstanding indebtedness of \$1,700, the executive committee of the republican state committee met at the office of State Treasurer George, chairman of this committee, this afternoon, to discuss ways and means for meeting the "widow's mite" sufficiently to meet the demand. Those present were: Chairman George, Secretary Perry, Assistant Secretary Craig, E. H. Gierke, of Fremont, treasurer of the committee; E. D. Beach, of Lincoln; O. D. Snyder, of O'Neill, and one or two others not connected with the committee.

According to Secretary Perry part of that deficiency has been subscribed, but not paid in, but these will still be a considerable sum left, and republicans who desire to see the committee get out of debt may send in contributions without fear of hurting the feelings of the committee.

A glance at the list of subscribers shows that republican congressmen paid but about half what democratic congressmen paid to the state committee of that party. Republican candidate for congress in the Third district, was the most generous of the congressional candidates, putting in \$20, Nebraska's democratic senator subscribed \$20 to the democratic state committee, but the republican list shows but \$100 subscribed by Senator Norris. H. B. Howell was the heaviest subscriber, being assessed \$200.
