CARRANZA NOW REFUSES TO QUIT

Chief of State Repudiates the Telegram by Gonzalez Saying that He Would Retire.

NO MENTION OF GUTIERREZ Says He Agreed to Resign if Villa Would Meet Him in Havana— Battle is Imminent North of Mexico City.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18.—General Carranza has repudiated the telegram sent for him by General Pablo Gonzalez to General Gutierrez, in which the first chief was represented as saying he would retire. This was announced today in an official dispatch from American Consul Hillman.

Three Shots Fired at Launch. CHIOS, Aegean Sea, Nov. 17.—The American armored cruiser Tennessee arrived in this port today. It is stated that yesterday, while the captain of the Tennessee was in the ship's launch, which was flying the American flag, on his way to pay the customary visits on the Turkish officials at Smyrna, three solid shots were fired at the boat by the forts.

Chios, at which port the cruiser Tennessee has arrived, is the capital of the island of the same name, located about four miles off the coast of Asia Minor and near the Gulf of Smyrna.

Captain Benton Clark Decker is in command of the Tennessee, which left New York on August 6, with nearly \$6,000,000 in gold on board for the relief of the American tourists stranded in Europe.
