Legislature Must Provide Machinery To Carry on Contest

(From a Staff Correspondent.) LINCOLN, Nov. 19.—(Special.)—If Representative F. L. Bollen of Croft succeeds in getting a recount of the ballots cast on constitutional amendments which lost out at the last election, he will have to secure it through a special act of the legislature and not through the usual methods used in a contest, according to an opinion given out by Attorney General Martin today in response to a letter addressed to the state legal department. Neumann to Contest Election of Spencer to the State Senate

BEATRICE, Neb., Nov. 19.—(Special.)—Julius Neumann of Wymore, defeated candidate for state senator from Gage and Pawnee counties, Wednesday evening announced that he would contest the election of A. D. Spencer, republican, who won by three votes. Mr. Neumann holds that the election was irregular in that illegal votes were cast. He asserts that in one township in Gage county he voted in heretofore has never been counted. He claims that laborers were sent here from Iowa to work and after voting were taken back to that state.

Custer County Will Hold Thirty Belgian Meetings Sunday

BROKEN BOW, Neb., Nov. 19.—(Special.)—Custer county, which had the distinction of leading all out-state counties in contributions to the Christmas ship, has again come to the front in the matter of relief for the war sufferers in a practical way. It is now proposed that Custer county send to the destitute in Belgium two or three carloads of wheat instead of one, as originally intended. To carry out this plan an executive committee has been appointed consisting of Rev. W. E. Guston, chairman; E. P. Steen, secretary; D. M. Amaberry, Judge Sullivan and Judge A. R. Humphrey, all of Broken Bow. This committee has arranged to hold next Sunday at 3 p. m. thirty mass meetings in as many places in the county and will furnish two speakers for each place. Subscriptions for wheat or its equivalent in money will be taken at each place, and inside of ten days it is proposed to send the loaded cars down the line with the legend, "Custer county wheat for starving Belgium!" The people everywhere over the county are enthusiastic over the movement, and with the splendid work being done by the executive committee the contribution will be assembled and on its way in a short time.

STOCKMAN ACCUSED OF BUYING STOLEN PROPERTY

LINCOLN, Nov. 19.—(Special.)—William Teuscher, a wealthy stockman of Milford, was yesterday charged by Sheriff Myers, charged with receiving stolen property, the charge being that he had bought 8,000 cubic centimeters of hog cholera serum from Michael Cody, a janitor at the state farm. Mr. Teuscher was arrested this afternoon and admitted that he had taken the serum and that the Milford man was the purchaser. Turks Win Naval Battle in Black Sea

BERLIN, Nov. 19.—(By Wireless to the Associated Press.)—A Turkish fleet has engaged a Russian squadron composed of two battleships and five cruisers off Sebastopol, according to an official report reaching Berlin from Constantinople today. One of the Russian battleships was seriously damaged, and the other vessels, with the Turkish ships in pursuit, fled to Sebastopol.
