

Official Report Declares that the Sultan's Army Occupied El Kantara After Fight.

CAMEL CORPS IS CAPTURED

Scene of Battle is Twenty-Five Miles from Port Sald on the Caravan Route Between Egypt

and Syria.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Nov. 21. - (By Marconi Wireless to London.)-Turkish troops have reached the Suez canal, according to an official communication made public here Sunday. The statement reads: "Turkish troops have reached the Suez canal. Fighting has occurred between Katas and Teatebe, both thirty kilometers east of the Suez canal and near Kantra Teo (probably El Kantara, twenty-five miles south of Port Said). "English officers as well as many
