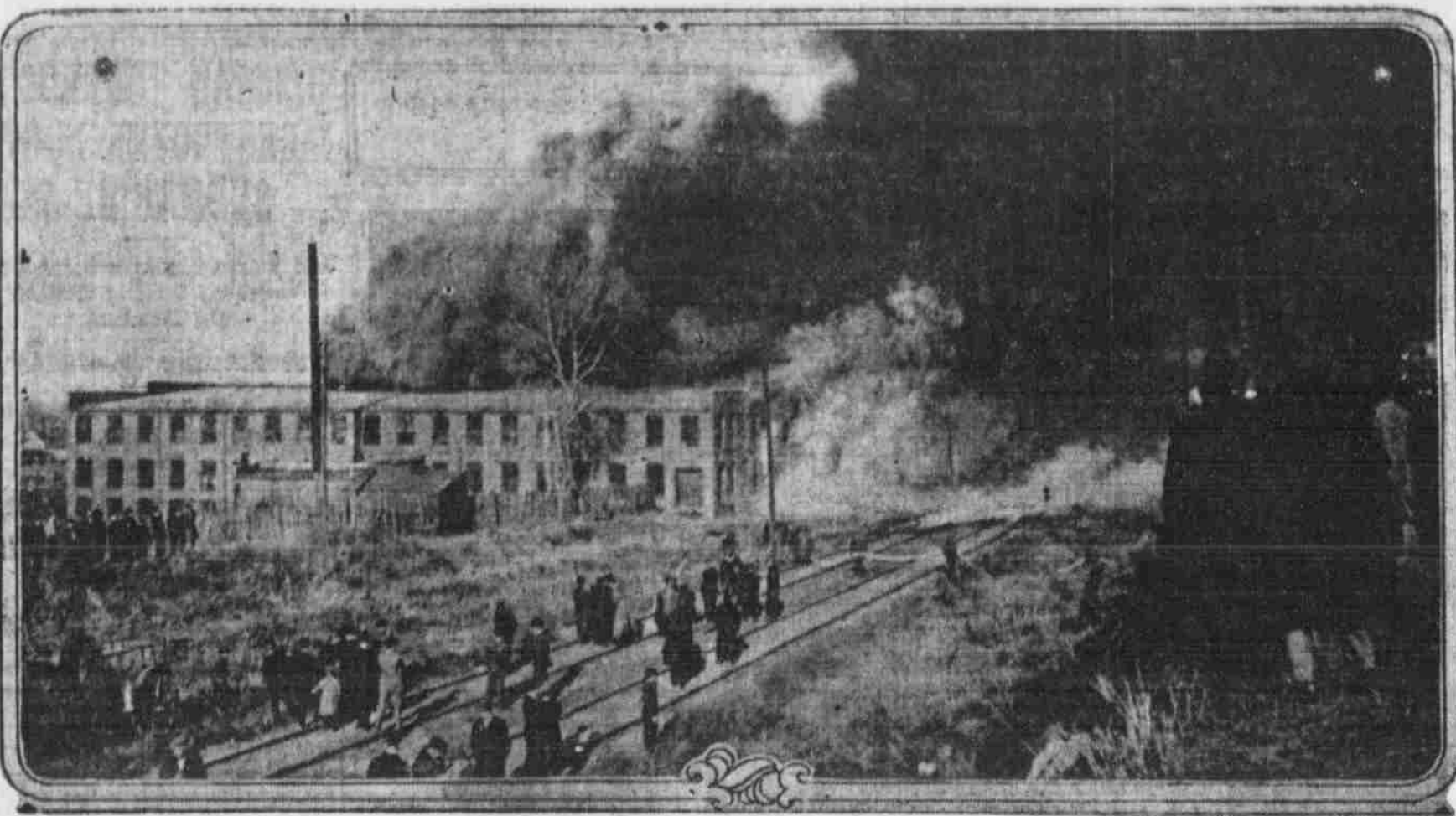

Cared for one of the children between 13 and 14 o'clock. At 3 o'clock I was up and went to the bath room, as I was not very well. Walter was asleep then. He did not leave his bed that night, except the one time he wailed on our little girl.

Other witnesses put on the stand by the defense in an effort to establish an alibi for the accused were James H. Burgher, father of Mrs. Walter Sammons, and Jake Mutchie, a Kearney carpenter. Burgher, both of the "Christmas" dinner of the Sammons families at the home of his elder daughter—and of his going to Walter Sammons' house with Mrs. Sammons and the two children early in the evening. Walter came home at 9:15 p. m. and was not intoxicated, Burgher said.

Mutchie testified that he saw Walter Sammons at the latter's home about 8:30 o'clock the night of the robbery. He did not sleep soundly, heard no noise that night, did not awaken until 4 or 5 o'clock the next morning, and an sure that Walter did not leave the house.

Arvid Johnson, a bartender, testified that he saw Delbert Smith and his brother, Lucien, at the theater. Bob Mann, a Kearney real estate man, said he saw Delbert Smith leave the theater during the show, and continuing, said: "The next morning, I met Walt Sammons and his father-in-law going down the street, but they made no mention of the robbery. They were talking after the robbery, and I was the chief man accused of the crime, he approached me to learn my version of Smith's actions on the night of the robbery."

Fern and His Testimony. John Fern, who was Kearney's "night police" at the time of the robbery, testified to having seen Smith on the street near the police station the night of the crime. Under cross-examination, Fern admitted that he resigned his position June 1, after hearing that charges were to be filed against him, alleging that he had been drunk and had brought women to Kearney for immoral purposes. He said that the charges were false, but that he resigned anyway, ran for sheriff and was defeated.

Gilman F. Roubush testified that he saw Del Smith one block from the post-office about 10 o'clock the night of the robbery. Under cross-examination, Roubush said that although he was ostensibly in the real estate and live-stock commission business, his total business during one year amounted to the sale of twenty head of cattle and three cheap lend deals. His other testimony was intended to impeach the story told by Cash during the morning session.

Cash Is Impeached. That Cash was in Montana at the time of the robbery, but that he had been asked to be a witness for the defense and had been paid money and given free board and room by the defense, were facts admitted by Cash under oath, when given a grilling examination by United States District Attorney F. S. Howell.

Cash, who has lived at Kearney for a long time, admitted on the stand at the beginning of his examination that he was in Montana when Sammons and Delbert Smith were alleged to have committed the robbery of the Kearney post-office last Christmas.
