Interesting Facts About Regal Motors

Most motorists are content to ride around over the power plants of their automobiles and leave what goes on inside the mechanism to Providence and the skill of the builder.

Take the average automobile motor with a flywheel stroke. How many people know that with ordinary gearing it revolves 2,444 times in driving the car one mile, while the pistons travel approximately one and one-half miles.

In the mean time 4,674 gallons of pure air and two wine glasses of gasoline have traversed the engine's system, together with a tablespoonful of lubricating oil.

Each valve has opened and closed 1,222 times, and as there are eight valves in a four-cylinder motor, there have been 9,776 valve movements.

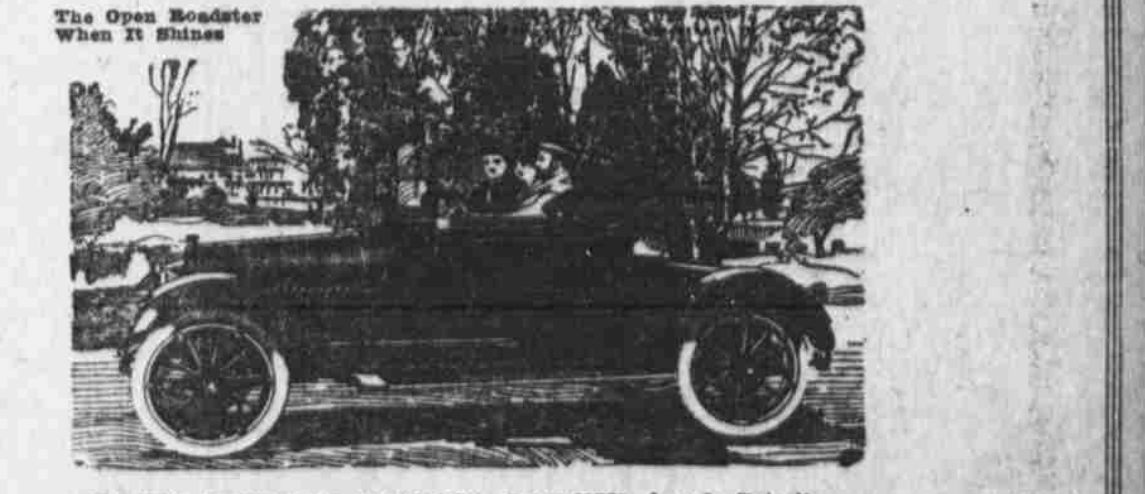
