Federal Deficit for November is About Sixteen Millions

WASHINGTON, Dec. 2.-Customs and internal revenue received for November show a marked decrease from the same month last year. Customs receipts were \$16,924,405, compared with \$21,173,608 for November, 1913, while internal revenue receipts at \$34,359,968, were nearly \$5,000,000 less than in the same month last year. For the month the excess of ordinary disbursements over receipts was \$15,890,883 compared with an excess of the sort last year of \$2,713,782.

Income from the war tax will begin to show this month. Custom receipts, despite the comparison with November, 1911, were \$60,000 greater than in October.
