Think Silk Thieves Men Who Swindled Farmer of Kimball

Two shifty young men describing themselves as H. Alberts, Carlton hotel, and H. D. Anderson, Midland hotel, and claiming to be "news-butchers" on trains, were arrested yesterday afternoon by Officers Wheeler and Reigelman in the Kimball store where they had stolen nearly \$100 worth of silks and other valuable merchandise.

While the two men were being searched at headquarters Detectives Del Rich and Jack Rezanowski came in. The two detectives have been seeking the confidence men who swindled a Kimball, Neb., farmer last week in a coin matching game in which the rustic lost \$100. "Well, this is pretty soft," exclaimed the detectives in a breath. "Here are the coin-men waiting for us right in our own dear jail."

The detectives say there is no doubt that the two men are the ones who outwitted the farmer. When searched, the prisoners each were found to be plentifully supplied with money. One man had \$200 and the other had \$175. Both were bound over to the district court, with bonds placed at \$1,250. Five "con-game" jobs, ranging from \$100 to \$200 each, have been accomplished by them in answer to the description of the above two. This will be investigated at once by the police.

Washington Affairs

The income tax law caused the deduction of a total of \$16,000 from the salaries of representatives in congress for the current year. The republican national congressional committee has \$7 in cash on hand after receiving \$36,218 in contributions and expending \$28,201 on the recent congressional campaign. President Wilson is hopeful now of an early clearing up of the Colorado coal strike situation. He is expected to refer to the question in his message to congress next week. Representative-elect Joseph G. Cannon of Illinois, former speaker of the house,

spent \$2,714 in his primary and election campaigns this year, according to his report of campaign expenses filed in Washington. The last important step preliminary to the actual operation of the \$125,000,000 cotton loan fund was taken by the cotton loan committee when it completed the list of state committees in eleven of the southern states. "City planning" as an all-important factor in municipal life was discussed by speakers at the convention of the American Civic association. Keen competition of commercial life and the intensity of struggles between individuals were declared responsible for many objectionable conditions existing in the larger cities. Orders were issued by Secretary Lane opening to homestead entry more than 20,000 acres of public lands in Oregon, Montana and New Mexico, which have been determined to be non-irrigable. After January 11, 1915, the lands may be taken up in tracts of 20 acres each under the enlarged homestead act.

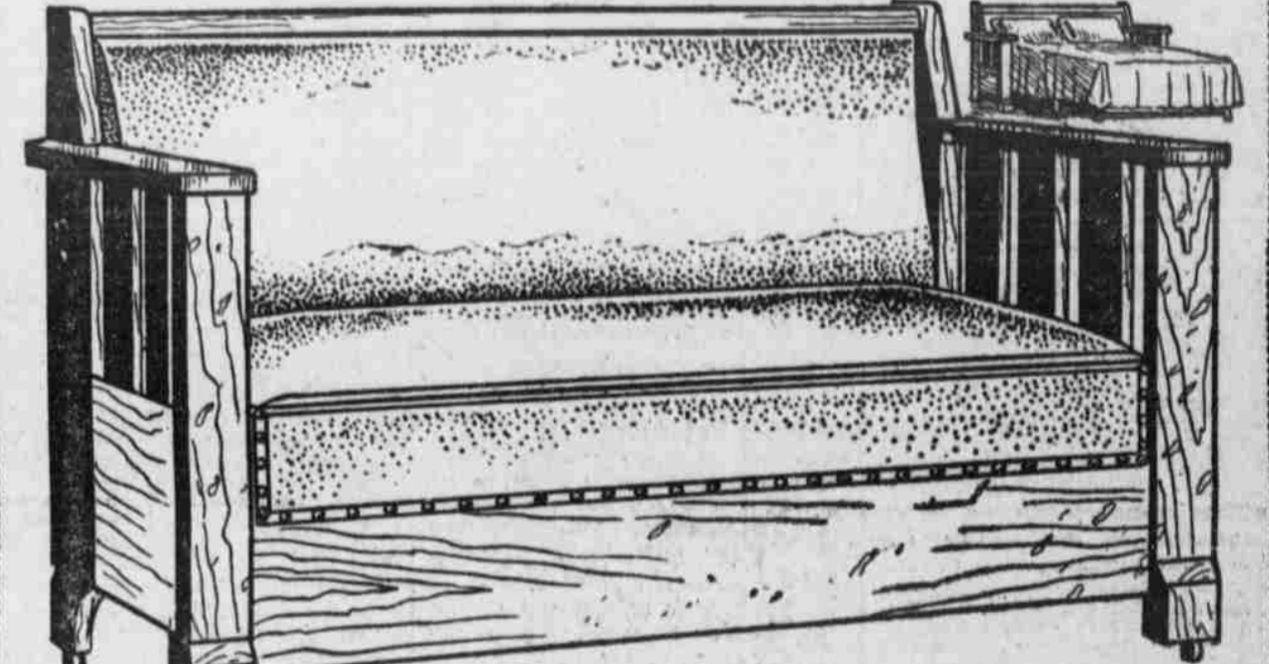
