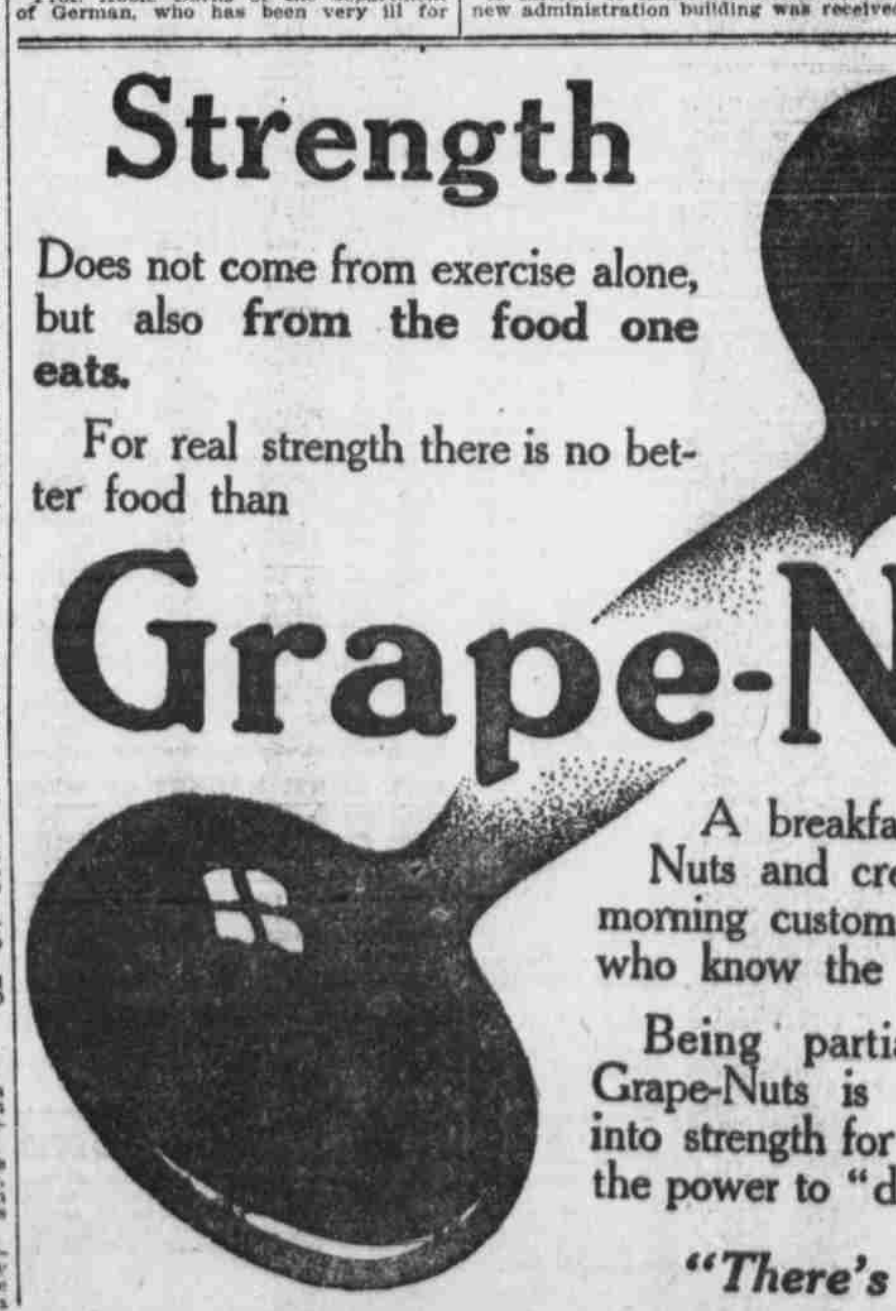
The members of the Glee club and the Treble Clef organization have just been chosen and announced by the director of music, Prof. H. C. Ruffe.
