CHICAGO, Dec. 19.—International anarchy is the factor of the present civilization causing the war, according to Dr. John Max of the University of Munich, president of the International Society of Students in an address here today.

"The main factor in international relations," he said, "is the desire for trade, gain, colonies and conquest. War is the necessary outcome of the present condition of society, which is international anarchy."
