"In most cases I have investigated, neither is true They know somebody or profess to know somebody that has the one or the other They belong to the great class of middlemen who want to make commissions. As a rule, they are fakes, pure and simpleat least, that has been my experience visible typewriter or anything I can use. Then he will run on: 'I understand you are purchasing supplies for foreign governments. Now I have so many head of horses, so many old overcoats, so many thousand rounds of ammunitien. so many cannon, so many guns of every description,' or something of the sort. I always let them talk, and then they won't believe me when I tell them I am buying

nothing.

"Then there is the other kind, who want to purchase anything in the nature of war supplies. They are just as mysterious. If they find out that I have horses they want me to give them an option on them for two or three days. When I ask them to take me to the real man who has the contract they admit that WHAT have you for Oliver typewriter,

borrow money from me. "Some of them make their way to m rooms, and if the door happens to be un locked they will open without knocking. If they see a piece of paper lying on the dressing table they will try to get near enough to it to see it. None of these I mention are German secret agents, be cause I know pretty well who those fellows are."-New York Times.
