Items in Detail.

Each of the four state normal schools is allowed exactly the same amount for salaries, maintenance and general expense as it had during the last two years.

The total under this head is \$500,000 divided as follows: Peru, \$105,000; Kearney, \$100,000; Wayne, \$110,000; Chadron, \$75,000.

In addition the committee provides for improvements at the different schools as herewith: Peru, \$13,500; Kearney, \$2,500; Wayne, \$14,500; Chadron, \$3,000.

The Peru appropriation for improvements includes \$6,000 to remodel the old training schools and \$6,000 for hiring and other necessary improvements to make the building modern.

Enough New Buildings. During the last biennium \$215,000 was spent for new buildings at the normal schools.
