UNKNOWN OLD MAN KILLS SELF BY CUTTING WRIST

In passing through a vacant lot at the southwest corner of Ninth and Howard streets, F. B. Duncan of the Drexel-Candy company found the body of an elderly man lying behind a pile of old boxes.

Investigating, he found that the fellow had twice slashed his left wrist with a razor, severing the artery. The coroner took the body and was of the opinion that the man had laid in the lot for a number of hours. Death came as the result of loss of blood. The arms of the suicide were covered with hypodermic scars, none of which appeared to have been inflicted recently.

It is believed that the old fellow unable to secure depositions had ended his life through desperation. No letter, papers or any other articles were found on the body to give any clue as to his identity. The police failed to recognize the man.
