NEW YORK, March 25—Dealings in stocks contracted considerably today, but prices continued to longe ahead, numerous new miso records for the year being scored. The advance included imany representative shares in the radicead class, such as Atchison, Great Northern, Yorthorn Pacific and Louisville & Nashville those showing gains of 1 to 2 points at their best.

Union Pacific retained its leadership with a substantial advance over its high price of the previous session and Southern Pacific, Baltimore & Ohio and a few stocks in the international list size went to higher levels.
