

PASSOVER FEAST IS NEXT ON THE LIST

Independence Day of the Jew to be Observed by Special Services.

CANTATA IS TO BE SUNG

Passover (Pesach) is the seven days festival observed by the Jew in the early spring in commemoration of the exodus from Egypt.

Starts With Family Services. The festival is ushered in by a family service, called the Seder, at which certain symbolic ceremonies are observed.

On the table are the unleavened cakes (matzo), the shin-bone of a lamb (roasted on the coals), commemorative of the Paschal sacrifice, a roasted egg, a mixture of apples and nuts (Charoseth) to symbolize the mortar with which the "Egyptians made bitter the lives" of the fathers, and bitter herbs (Maror), reminiscent of the unhappy days in Egypt.

In Song and Story. In song and story, the tale of the oppression and the deliverance is rehearsed. Psalms of thanksgiving (Hallel), strike the keynote of the happy occasion. The services, interrupted for the family dinner, close with a number of merry folk-songs, expressive of the character of the celebration.

Services are held in the synagogue and sermons preached in keeping with the thoughts of the festival. Excerpts from, or, in some cases, the whole book of the Song of Songs, are read.

MOONGLADE. By the author of "The Martyrdom of An Zhenzhen." 32 Pp. \$1.25. Harper & Brothers.

PEPPER. By Holworthy Hall. 216 Pp. \$1.25. The Century company. Pepper being the middle name of the chief character—one James P. McHenry, a Harvard undergraduate and a chap of resource and romance, of moods and money, of diabolical genius and unflinching humor. Pepper is also an adequate description of the book, which depicts in picturesque English and a particularly appealing sort of slang the many larks and adventures incident to Harvard undergraduate life.

ARUNDEL. By E. P. Benson. 311 Pp. \$1.25. George H. Doran company. It happens not infrequently that the hero and the heroine of a novel have a hard fight to hold their proper share of the reader's interest in competition with some one or more of the minor characters. Seldom, however, do they have so difficult a task as that assigned to Elizabeth Fanshawe and Edward Hervey, and it may as well be admitted at once that while Elizabeth comes through the ordeal triumphantly, winning and keeping not only interest, but affection as well, Edward fails to obtain either.
