

NO WAR REPORTS FOR THESE WOMEN

Betty Stoll and Two Other Austrian Women Adopt a Plan and Then Go Into Hiding.

BARRICADED IN THE HOME (Correspondence of the Associated Press.) AMSTERDAM, March 30.—Austrian papers received here tell how three women who had chosen to liberate through the war have been discovered by the Prague police hidden away in a strongly barricaded house in that city.

The chief of police recently received a letter from a resident in the Konwikstrasse, stating that the widow, Betty Stoll, together with her two daughters, had been murdered. The writer of the letter, on being interrogated, said that for many weeks no one had been seen to leave the house, the window shutters of which remained closed all the time.

German Woodworkers Urge that Hatred Be Kept Out of War (Correspondence of the Associated Press.) AMSTERDAM, March 30.—"We found it impossible to avoid the war, but let us at least take care that it is not conducted with hatred," states a bulletin sent from the German Federation of Wood Workers to the international headquarters of the wood workers' unions in France.

Autograph Copy of Goethe Comedy Found (Correspondence of the Associated Press.) BERLIN, March 30.—An autograph copy of Goethe's comedy, "The Accomplish," written in his youth, has been found among the effects of an aged woman, who recently died in Dresden.

VIENNA, March 30.—Forty thousand letters, in more than forty languages and dialects, to be read daily; secret messages written in cipher with invisible inks to be discovered and puzzled out; all manner of questions from distracted parents about the whereabouts of their sons to be answered; thousands of complaints from Austrians regarding their treatment in foreign detention camps and prisons to be investigated.

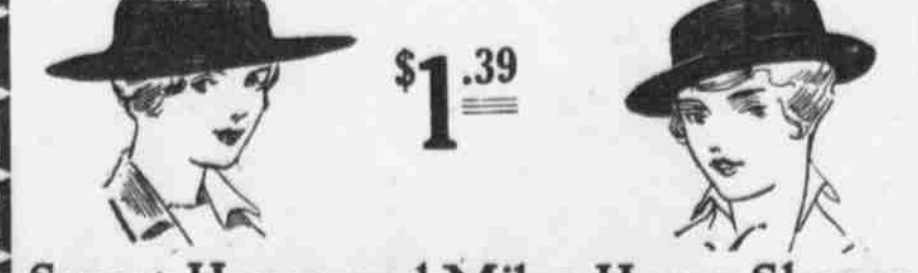
