FIRST SPRING RAIN FALLS

Light Precipitation is General Over State, Starting Tuesday and Continuing Next Day

PONCA CREEK BECOMES RIVER

The first of the spring rains of the season fell Tuesday night over practically all of the state, according to reports to the railroad. In many localities they continue yesterday with temperatures of 69 degrees and above.

Along the Missouri valley Tuesday night's rain was the lightest of any section across to the mountains. Beatrice, Chester, Superior, Wilber, Republican, McCook, Benkleman, Aurora, Seward, Ericson, Burwell and Pauline reported one-half to three-quarters of an inch; Madrid, Orleans, St. Paul, Holdrege, Minden and Gothenburg, an inch, and Sargent, two inches.

Through the extreme northern portion of the state a rain of from one to two inches was general and continued at 9 o'clock in the morning. In this locality some damage is reported on account of the high water caused by the melting snow and the heavy rain.

The Northwestern's grade on the Bonsteel branch has been washed considerably at points where the grade extends up the Ponca creek valley. In a distance of thirty miles the road crosses this creek fifteen times. The creek is out of its banks and a number of the bridges are threatened. Today an emergency train was sent out from Norfolk and all section men along the line have been taken to the bridges, where they are working to save them.
