First Meeting of New Organization Addressed by Prof. F. M. Fling After Banquet.

WILL SECURE FINE PAINTINGS

The Friends of Art association, newly formed to encourage and stimulate an interest in fine arts in Omaha, held its first banquet at the Hotel Fontenelle last night and went into permanent organization.

John L. Webster was elected president, William D. McHugh was made vice president, Edgar H. Scott was made secretary and Victor Caldwell treasurer.

Purpose of Association. This organization came about some weeks ago 100 men in the city, lovers of art, signed a pledge to give each \$5 a year for a period of five years toward the encouragement of art in Omaha.


