

IMPROVED BY GOOD SOAKING

Organ that is Rescued from River Bottom Now Has a Wonderful Tone.

The waters of the Cumberland river, sold for a mere song because it was regarded as little more than "junk," and now being rebuilt because experts regard it as one of the finest toned instruments in the country—that is the history of the pipe organ at St. David's Episcopal church.

Its original cost was \$4,000. The organ was built sixty-three years ago by a Boston firm, stayed for thirty years in a church in Baltimore; then it was sold to the Cumberland (Md.) church. It was while it was being transported to Cumberland that the accident befell it.

As it was being ferried across the Cumberland river it slipped from the boat and lay submerged for three weeks before it was rescued and taken to Cumberland. Thirteen years ago the Rev. Mr. Sargent presented it to St. David's. The work of taking the organ to pieces

and putting it together again is as difficult as making a watch. The work is being done by former Choirmaster E. E. Holloway. He is as precise and painstaking in his work as the most careful watchmaker.

There are 1,304 pipes in the organ, the largest being fifteen and one-half feet long and 3 1/2 inches in diameter. The smallest pipe is three-fourths of an inch long and one-eighth of an inch in diameter. In between these two extremes are pipes of every size and tone, from the deepest bass, whose vibrations make the

walls of heaviest masonry quiver, to tones so high and thin and treble that they can hardly be heard at all.—Indianapolis News.
