Mr. Wolf is to build a ten story, all modern, fireproof building. Architect John McDonald is working on the plans already. Whether the structure is to be decided as yet. It is the intention of Welf that the structure shall be used for store purposes only. While no leases have de yet been made for space in the building. Mr. Wolf has a number of propositions pending with prospective tenants who will likely ocupy the store spaces as soon as a buildng can be completed.

While definite figures are not given

out, it is said the ground was leased on the basis of a \$700,000 valuation. Mr. Joslyn paid \$600,000 to the Union Securities company for the property in purchas-
