ROURKES CAPTURE SECOND OF SERIES

St. Joseph Gives Poor Support to Three Hurlers in Row and Drops Game.

FINAL COUNT IS NINE TO SEVEN

ST. JOSEPH, Mo., April 25.—(Special Telegram)—Altdy to miserable fielding by the locals Omaha this afternoon won the third and final game of the opening series her, 9 to 7, making the series stand two to one. Clossman, Crabb and Blodgett pitched well at times, but all were unsteady and only fair fielding at times would have saved the game for St. Joseph.

First Run on Error.

Eleventh Strike It.

The deciding tally came in the eleventh. Smith led off with a two-base hit and Green attempted a sacrifice. Britton fielded the bunt and then threw wild to first, Smith scoring and Green taking second. Payne sacrificed and Green scored on Thompson's hit to Britton. Agnew neglecting to touch the Omaha player as he did home.

A base on balls, an error and a stolen base sent St. Joseph's first run over in the second. One tallied in the fourth on a hit batsman and a two-base hit. Four singles in a row sent two over in the sixth and one registered on a pair of singles and a stolen base in the seventh.
