

WINTER WHEAT ABOVE AVERAGE

Burlington's Weekly Crop Report Shows Conditions Ahead of Any Former Year.

LARGE ACREAGE FOR CORN

The Burlington's Nebraska crop report for the week ending last Saturday night shows that the winter wheat of the state still continues in a better condition than at any corresponding period during former years.

Omaha division, 100 per cent. Lincoln division, 100 per cent. Wynona division, 100 per cent. McCook division, 100 per cent.

Spring grain is up and is making rapid growth.

It is estimated that up to last Saturday night about 50 per cent of the corn acreage had been planted, with practically all of the crop in the ground by the end of the present week.

No Freezing Weather.

During the week there were no freezing weather, or severe frosts in any portion of the state and as a result, the prospects for an immense fruit crop is the best in years.

In the western part of the state, where they are grown extensively, a goodly portion of the sugar beet have been planted.

The Burlington's report indicates that aside from a limited area along the Missouri river, there was an abundance of rain last week and that in no locality are crops in immediate need of moisture.

Over the Lincoln division during the week the precipitation ranged from one-half inch at Sargent to three and one-half inches at Hastings, the heavy rains being well distributed; the Wyoming division showed one-half inch at Adams, with three inches at Strang; the McCook division, three-fourth of an inch at Ayr to three and one-half inches at McCook.

Whitehead Asserts East Expects Omaha to Make Big Gains

Chief Clerk Whitehead of the Burlington's passenger department has returned from a three weeks' trip to New York and the east. Throughout the east Mr. Whitehead found business conditions improved and everybody feeling optimistic.

"All through the east they are looking toward the central west, having heard of its continued prosperity, while other sections of the country have been less favored. They have heard of our rich agricultural lands, our great cattle ranges and the prospects that we have for another bumper crop this year. These conditions have advertised the central west and it is no longer an unknown section of the country, either in financial, business or home circles."

"Nearly every place I went I was asked concerning Omaha, and this was frequently said to me, 'You have a boom out there, have you not?'"

"Invariably I told the people that Omaha has no symptoms of a boom, but that owing to the wonderful resources in its trade territory, its geographical location, its railroad center and its facilities for reaching out and gathering in business, it is enjoying a good, steady and substantial growth."

"Everywhere the people of the east seem to know of Omaha, and everywhere they look upon it as one of the best cities in the country and one that is to keep on growing until it becomes the metropolis of the country between the lakes and the Pacific coast."

Railroad Manager Sees Banner Crop in Sight for 1915

Assistant General Manager Greer of the Burlington lines west of the Missouri river is in from a tour that took him over that portion of the system in Nebraska, Kansas and Wyoming. Said Mr. Greer:

"It looks as if this is to be the banner crop year for the farmers and stock raisers of the central west. Never at this season of the year have I seen the conditions as favorable as now. Winter wheat all over our territory is in the best possible condition. There are no bad spots and the plant is far advanced. The acreage is fully up to, if not above the normal."

"In Nebraska and Kansas, corn planting is well under way and with good weather this week, by Saturday night the greater portion of the acreage will be planted."

"The range is prime and right now cattle are rapidly taking on flesh. The sheep shearing in western Nebraska and Wyoming is about finished."

"Everywhere, except in the immediate valley of the Missouri river, last week there were heavy rains, putting the ground in perfect condition and this, with warm weather, is pushing all vegetation ahead at a wonderful rate."
