

### ROWDIES TEAR UP G. O. P. BANNERS

Auto Carrying Rifle and Drum Corps and Bearing Republican Banners is Assaulted.

#### TO PROSECUTE THE CULPRITS

During the forenoon an assault was made upon the auto truck that was being driven about the city in the interest of the straight republican ticket. The auto carried a rifle and drum corps and on the sides and rear were large banners calling attention of voters to the republican ticket and urging them to vote for it.

While the auto truck was coming north on Thirteenth street, at the intersection of William and in front of the polling place there, a couple of ticket peddlers rushed out from the crowd and commenced tearing off the banners. One attacked one side of the machine and the second the other. Through the banners they drove sticks and before the musicians in the car could interfere, the cloth was ripped into strips. The musicians drove the men away, but not until they had completely destroyed all three of the banners.

Ed Leeder, who was on the auto truck at the time, asserts that a policeman watched the entire proceeding, but made no effort to interfere.

World Polish Carriers. After the South Thirteenth street incident, the auto truck was driven to republican headquarters, where a crowd soon congregated, everybody expressing indignation James Walsh, who has been active in championing the cause of the republican ticket, said:

"This dastardly outrage should not be permitted to go unpunished. We propose to find out who are the culprits and prosecute them to the full extent of the law. Even in the south before the days of reconstruction such an attempt to prevent an honest election and the casting of a republican ballot would not have been tolerated. We do not know at this time who the parties were, but we propose to find out. We know that they were men and not boys, for they were active about the polls."
