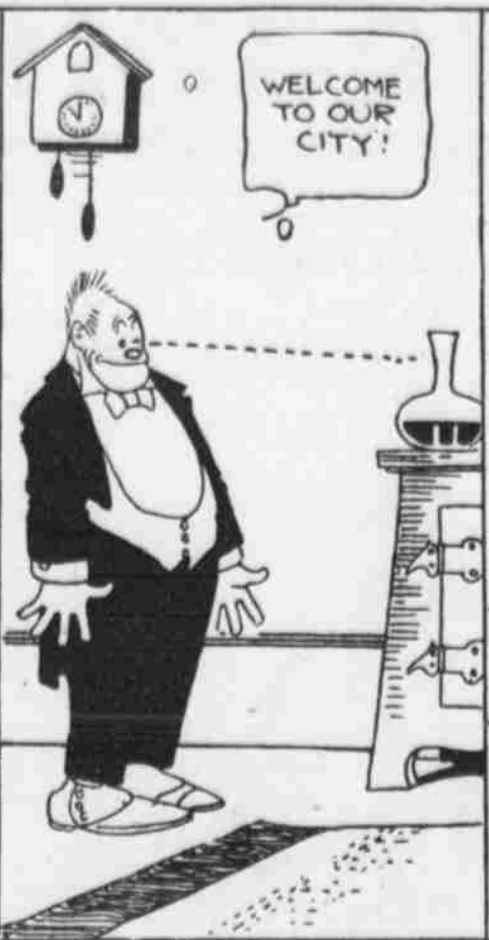


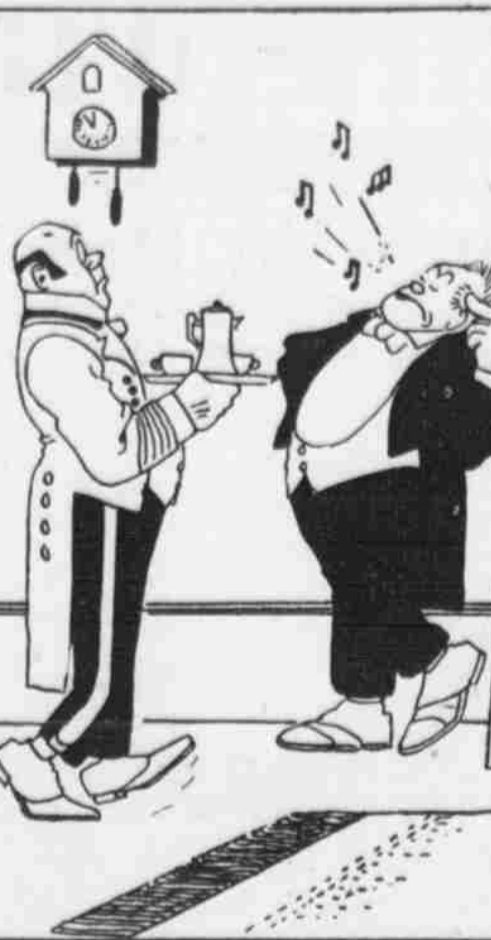

DES MOINES, May 12.—(Special Telegram)—A ninth inning rally drove Musser from the box and scored five runs, which tied up the score for the Rourkes in the last game of the series here today. An attempted rally by the Boosters failed in the last of the ninth and the game was called on account of darkness at the end of the tenth with the score tied, 7 to 7.

Musser had things pretty much his own way until the ninth. In that frame successive singles by Schliebner, Whalen, Payne, who batted for Clesman, Smith and a double by Forsythe scored four runs, when Krueger doubled, scoring the former with the tying run.

The Boosters made one in the first and one in the second, singles by Hunter followed by Sawyer's double getting the first and doubles by Hartford and Price getting the second.
